

WCTA BURSARY FOR ADIT STUDENTS OUTSIDE THE UK

ADIT

The Worshipful Company of Tax Advisers (WCTA) is a City of London Livery Company whose objects are primarily to advance the standing and profession of tax advisers but also include the promotion of education in the field of taxation.

The Court of the WCTA has decided to award this bursary annually to three deserving candidates for the ADIT qualification.

Eligible persons

Those permanently resident and studying outside the UK, the Channel Islands and the Isle of Man for the ADIT qualification offered by The Chartered Institute of Taxation (CIOT).

Funds available

A maximum of £1,500 over a 12-month period, to be paid against supplier receipts for books, other materials and/or course fees necessary or relevant for the purpose of studying for the ADIT qualification.

Criteria

Proven need for financial assistance in paying for study materials and/or course fees. This is to be shown by a general explanation of your financial position, submitted as part of the application. This information will be treated in the utmost confidence and will be destroyed after the decision with regard to the application has been made.

All applications will be assessed by the CIOT; the WCTA will rely heavily on the CIOT's assessment.

Further applications

Any applicant, whether successful or unsuccessful in his or her application in any year, may apply again in a subsequent year.

Timing of applications

The WCTA bursary is offered on an annual, calendar year basis. Applications for each year's bursary should be received by the CIOT on or before 31 October of the immediately preceding year. **The decision of the WCTA is final and no further correspondence will be entered into regarding the award of, or the refusal to award, a bursary.**

Process for submission of applications

Applications for the WCTA bursary should be made online via the CIOT website, ahead of the 31 October closing date. The online application form can be found at www.tax.org.uk/adit/bursaries.

Eligible applications will then be considered after the closing date has passed, and applicants will be notified of the outcome within three months.
