Monday 19 through Friday 23 February	Central Voting Office decides on requests for amendment and makes changes where necessary (Art. 12, paragraph 3)
Monday 26 February	Central Voting Office finalises electoral register (Art. 12, paragraph 5)

Appointment of a member of the Student Council for a seat on the Central Student Council (designation of member to be delegated)
 No later than 09:00 on Friday 16 June 2022, the chairperson of the Faculty Student Council shall inform the Central Voting Office which member will represent the Student Council in the Central Student Council. This deadline also applies to councils that choose not to put forth a delegate (this often applies to the Student Council at the Faculty of Dentistry). As soon as it is known that a seat in the Central Student Council will not be occupied by one or more delegates, the Central Voting Office can decide which party will be allocated the resulting residual seat (according to the standard for the allocation of residual seats, i.e. the party that obtained the most votes on average per seat).
