

Information on the disclosure of personal data

Before you decide to share your personal data with your stem cell donor, we would like to give you some considerations.

Of course, for you as a stem cell recipient, the positive aspects of direct contact are the most important, for example, that you get to know your 'genetic twin' personally and that perhaps, as with many encounters that have already taken place, a lasting and valuable friendship can develop. Many stem cell recipients also feel a great need to say "thank you", which direct contact only really gives you the opportunity to do.

However, the exchange of personal data also entails risks.

After the exchange of personal data has taken place, you are no longer protected by the anonymity that the donor registry and the transplant center have guaranteed you. If claims or disagreements arise between you and the donor, DKMS and the transplant center can no longer influence them.

You and the donor share important tissue characteristics. However, this does not necessarily mean that you are also similar or identical in other aspects of your lives. Along with the fascinating questions about similarities between you and the donor, differences may also exist. Thus, a contact between you and the donor can be or become difficult or even break off.

Information on Data Protection

- DKMS Donor Center gGmbH and DKMS Group gGmbH (both located at Kressbach 1, 72072 Tübingen, Germany) are in part individually and in part jointly responsible for data processing.
- The DKMS data protection officer can be reached at datenschutz@dkms.de.
- The purpose of data processing is to establish direct contact with the stem cell recipient.
- The legal basis for this is your consent in accordance with Article 6 (1) sentence 1 lit. a of the European General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR).
- For the establishment of the direct contact, the personal data will be transmitted to the donor.
- According to the GDPR, you are entitled to the following rights with regard to your personal data: Access to information according to Art. 15 GDPR, data correction according to Art. 16 GDPR, deletion according to Art. 17 GDPR, blocking (restriction of processing) according to Art. 18 GDPR and data transfer according to Art. 20 GDPR.
- Your consent is voluntary and you may revoke it vis-à-vis DKMS at any time and without giving reasons. The revocation does not affect the lawfulness of the data processing carried out on the basis of the consent until the revocation. Already disclosed information to the donor cannot be reversed.
- You have a right of appeal to a data protection supervisory authority in accordance with Art. 77 GDPR, in particular to the authority responsible for your place of residence or to the authority responsible for DKMS (State Commissioner for Data Protection and Freedom of Information of Baden-Württemberg).
