This webinar will be presented by [Michel Wyndaele](#), a urologist at the [University Medical Center Utrecht](#) in the Netherlands, and [Wouter van der Sanden](#), a urologist at [Jeroen Bosch Hospital](#) in Den Bosch, the Netherlands, and a PhD candidate on Ketamine Induced Uropathy.

As the recreational use and abuse of ketamine is increasing worldwide, the prevalence of **ketamine induced uropathy** is increasing rapidly as well.

Ketamine induced uropathy is an inflammatory bladder disorder with specific characteristics among the challenging young addicted patient population, including the devastating reinforcing cycle of induced pain leading to increased ketamine use to suppress the pain, again inducing more **damage to the urinary tract**.

Patients present with debilitating lower urinary tract symptoms and **(upper and lower) urinary tract dysfunction**, which may become irreversible and eventually lead to the necessity for **urinary tract reconstruction**, which has a lifelong impact.

In this webinar, we will present an overview of the **epidemiology, clinical presentation, pathophysiology, diagnostic assessment, and treatment** of ketamine induced uropathy to raise awareness of this fast-growing health problem and provide insights specific to ketamine induced uropathy.
