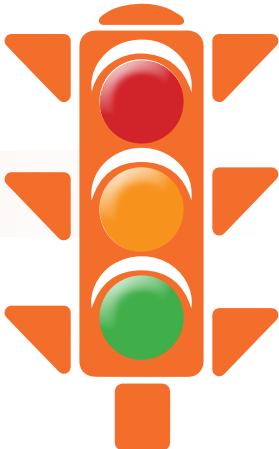

The end-point assessment methods are:

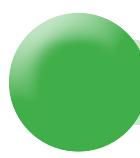
Work-based project with questioning:

- 4,500-word project (+/- 10% if necessary)
- 60-minute questioning session with an independent assessor
- a minimum of 12 questions asked during the questioning

Professional discussion

underpinned by portfolio:

- a 60-minute professional discussion
- portfolio of evidence submitted at gateway, which is not directly assessed
- a minimum of 12 questions asked during the professional discussion
