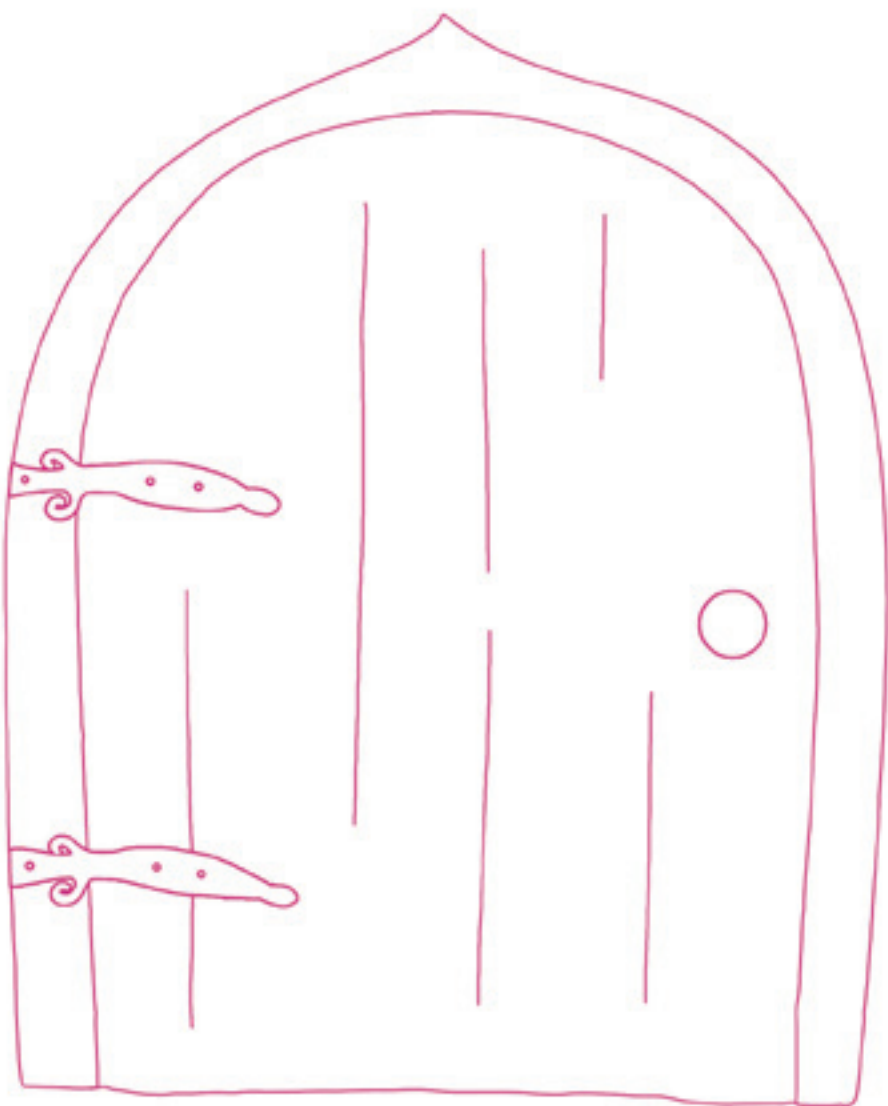

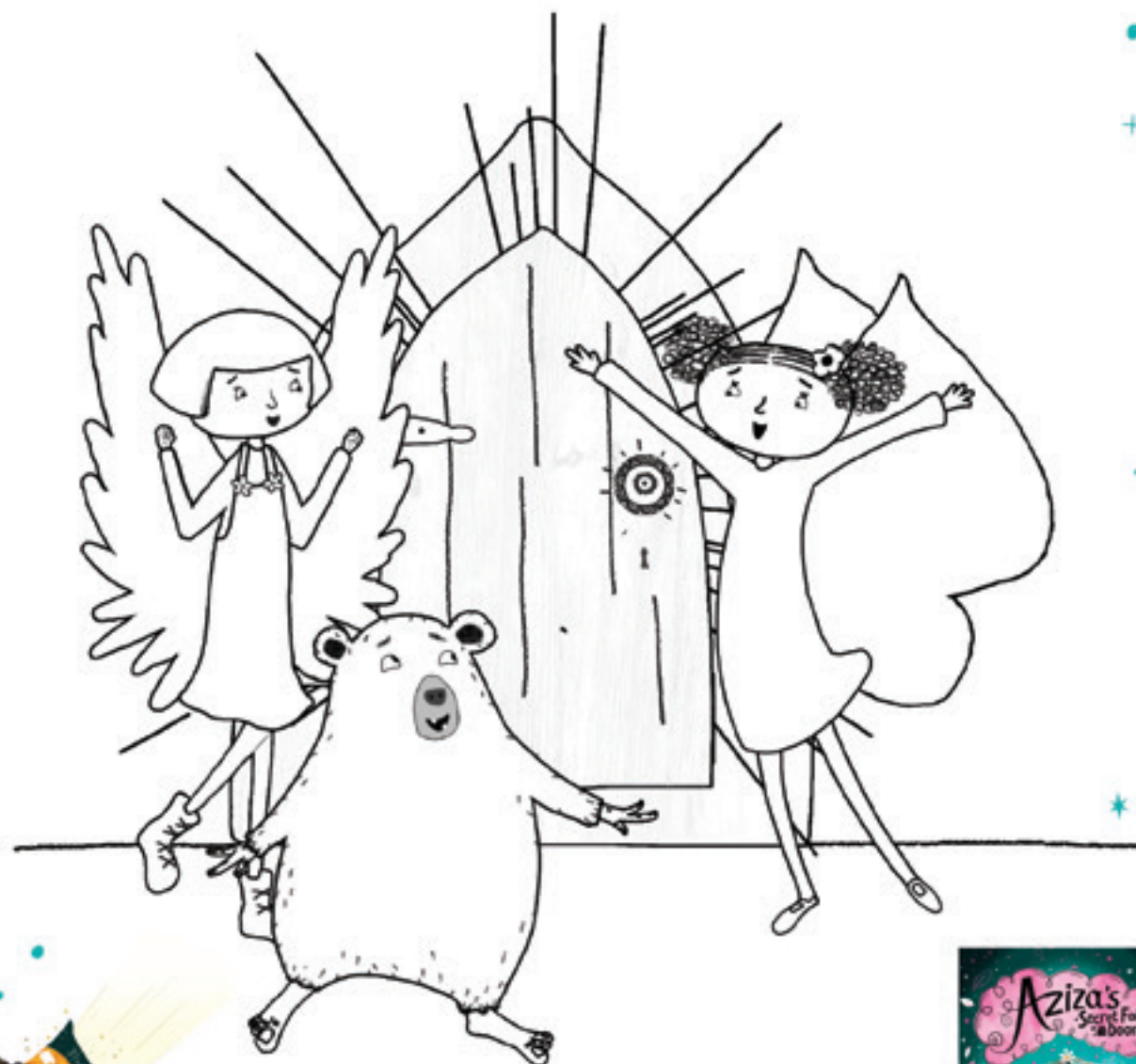

## Make your own fairy wings with Aziza

Get ready for your very own fairy adventure!

### What you'll need:

- Piece of cardboard (e.g. a flattened cereal box)
- Pencil
- Scissors
- Items to decorate – felt tips, glitter, paint, stickers or cut out pictures from magazines or wrapping paper for a collage effect
- Glue stick
- Two equal length pieces of string – you could also use ribbon or elastic

1. Take your cardboard and lay it out flat. Fold your piece of cardboard down the middle – each half will be one wing.

2. On one side of cardboard draw a wing shape.

3. Ask an adult to help you cut the wings out with the scissors.

**TIP:** If you leave the cardboard folded in half you can cut both wings out at once and they will be a perfect match!

4. Lay your wings out flat again and decorate your fairy wings however you like – why not add some glitter or colour them in with felt tip markers. Don't forget to decorate both sides!

5. To make the straps for your wings, take your pencil and ask an adult to help you punch two holes in the middle of your wings. You can use the fold line from earlier as a guide. One hole should be near the top, and one near the bottom.

6. Thread one piece of string through the hole at the top and the other end through the hole at the bottom. Tie both ends together at the back.

7. Repeat Step 6 with your second piece of string. You should now have two straps. When you put the wings on, the strings should pull tight. If your sections are too long, undo the knots to adjust the length of the straps to fit.

8. Now you can have your very own fairy adventure!
