

What are the rules for carrying portable electronic devices with built-in lithium batteries?

## What are the rules for carrying spare / separately transported batteries not installed in equipment, including power banks?

Spare batteries must be individually protected and either kept in the manufacturer's original packaging or have their terminals insulated to prevent short circuits.

If your batteries fall under the category requiring airline approval, you must submit a **request** in advance and attach the completed form.

\* Some countries may apply stricter rules for carrying lithium batteries and power banks. For example, on flights departing from Seoul, passengers may carry no more than 5 lithium batteries with a capacity of up to 100 Wh each. Before travelling, we recommend checking the latest requirements of your destination country and, if applicable, any transit countries.
