A sad time for South East officiating - in memory of Paul Shackman.

Welcome to our final newsletter of the season. This note would normally be written by our chair Paul Shackman. As you all know Paul sadly passed away on April 8<sup>th</sup> 2026.

South East Hockey is deeply saddened to share the news of the passing of Paul Shackman, a much-loved member of our hockey community whose commitment and influence have shaped the sport across our region for many decades.

Paul's connection to hockey began at Worthing Hockey Club, where he played as a goalkeeper for many years.

His enthusiasm for the game was infectious; he encouraged his family to take up hockey and remained a cornerstone of the club's community. In recognition of his dedicated service and loyalty, he was proudly made a Vice President of Worthing HC last year.

Following his playing days, Paul turned his passion toward umpiring, becoming a Level 2 umpire and going on to officiate throughout the Southern Counties Region.

His role as the appointment secretary saw him coordinating officials across Kent, Surrey, Sussex, Hampshire, Berkshire, Buckinghamshire, Oxfordshire, Middlesex and London, a task he undertook with care, professionalism, and unflinching generosity.

Paul's commitment to developing others truly set him apart. As a Level 2 umpire coach, he mentored countless officials, helping them to progress and flourish in their roles. Among those he encouraged was Frances Block, who went on to umpire at the London 2012 Olympics, one of many who benefited from Paul's wisdom and supportive nature.

His leadership extended to the Sussex Umpires Association, where he served as Chair before becoming the first Chair of the South East Area Officiating Committee. In that role, Paul guided the newly formed structure with experience and pride, contributing tirelessly as a member of the South East Area Management Team. His vision and commitment helped shape officiating in our region and leave a lasting legacy that will continue to benefit clubs, officials, and players alike.

Paul will be remembered not only for his dedication and service but for his warmth, humour, and genuine love for the game. His passing is a moment of deep loss for all who knew him, in Worthing HC, across Sussex, and throughout the entire South East hockey family.

We extend our heartfelt condolences to Paul's family, friends, and everyone at Worthing Hockey Club. His contribution to our sport and community will never be forgotten.

*May he rest in peace, and may his decades of service continue to inspire future generations of umpires and players.*

### CONSISTENCY OF ASSESSMENT

Amongst our challenges is consistency of assessment. To address this, we bring together coaches and assessors to all watch and assess the umpires on a game, they then compare notes and scores.

These dialogues generate debate which then helps us get more consistency.

At the beginning of the season we publish a guide outlining what we expect to see to enable an umpire to progress through the panels. **The feedback on that has been extremely positive.**

Plans are well underway for a pre-season session on **Saturday the 12th of September starting at 10:00. We will be going back to Caterham School.** We are planning a more interactive session and will have the new England Hockey officiating manager with us all day. Part of that session will be about the new pathway for umpiring and he will also be helping us work our way through any new rules that England hockey choose to adopt.

As in previous years, this will be a chance for us to present our annual awards. We will send out an invitation and would ask that you respond so that we can plan catering requirements.

We are investing more effort this year in helping club umpire development and you will see more on that later from **Philip Hook** in this newsletter.

# MONDAY MIXERS REPORT



## This season's popular Monday Mixers have been well attended by SE Members:

The Monday Mixers have once again been an important part of the season, providing a regular space for umpires across the region to connect, share experiences and keep developing together. Across the season we delivered 10 sessions, with an average attendance of 35, which reflects the value people place on them and the consistency of engagement across the year.

It is important to recognise the contribution **Duncan** has made in establishing and leading the Monday Mixers over a sustained period. He has built something that people trust and want to be part of, which has given the programme a really strong foundation. I was pleased to take on hosting duties from mid February and carry things through the remainder of the season, building on what was already in place.

There have been some real highlights across the year, particularly the sessions where we welcomed guest speakers. **Kwan Browne** joined us earlier in the season and gave a really useful perspective on how players see the game, including tactical trends, behaviours in key areas of the pitch and how umpires can influence important moments. We also heard from **Rebecca Edwards**, who shared her journey through umpiring alongside some honest and practical insights into preparation, matchday habits and managing the balance alongside other commitments. Both sessions added something a bit different and were very well received.

The strength of the Monday Mixers continues to be the range and relevance of the discussions. Over the course of the season, we covered a wide variety of topics including managing key moments such as penalty corners and disciplinary decisions, communication with players, benches and between umpires, and the interpretation of more challenging areas of the rules. There has also been a strong focus on preparation, feedback and reflection, as well as wider game management including consistency, presence and handling pressure. Alongside this, we have also worked through some of the more practical elements such as GMS processes, reporting and expenses. Importantly, these conversations have been grounded in real match experiences, which has helped keep the sessions practical and relevant throughout.

At the start of the season the aim was to provide a consistent touchpoint, keep the content relevant and create an environment where people felt comfortable contributing. Looking back, that has largely been achieved. The sessions kept a regular rhythm, adapted to reflect what was happening across the game and allowed space for open discussion rather than following a fixed structure, which has been a key part of their success.

Overall, the Monday Mixers are in a strong position. They have been well attended, continue to provide value to those involved and have played an important role in building a more connected and aligned umpiring community across the South East region.

## TEAM AND UMPIRE FEEDBACK MATCH REPORTS

The submission of Umpire match reports and Team umpire feedback reports during the season was very low.

- 7 Men's teams (19%) out of a total of 36 teams have completed their Umpire feedback reports.
- 6 Women's teams (17%) out of a total of 35 teams have completed their Umpire feedback reports.

Only Folkestone Men's and Women's teams

have completed all their reports required for the season.

### Umpire Feedback match reports

On average each week only 32 (47%) of appointed SE Panel umpires complete their match reports. Without this small task completed by the umpires it is very hard for officiating and development to make any judgements on Clubs/teams etc. and offer any additional support for umpires that is required.

# ● ● ● ● ● .../ DISCIPLINARY SUMMARY

One particularly positive trend is the reduction in dissent-related red cards issued after the final whistle (formerly MMOs). This suggests that the "30-minute rule" initiative shared last year with clubs outlining the best practices is having a positive effect. Please continue to reinforce this approach to all your members.

## **THE 30-MINUTE RULE**

Allow at least 30 minutes or wait until you're back in the clubhouse before discussing the decisions in the game with the umpires. This short pause gives everyone time to cool off, including the umpires, and helps ensure any conversations are constructive rather than emotional.

That said, please still take a moment to shake hands and thank them for umpiring—it's a simple gesture that goes a long way in maintaining respect and mutual appreciation.

## **ADVICE ON DISSENT AND ESCALATION**

A problem we continue to see is red cards issued where players escalate dissent even after receiving a green or yellow card. These earlier cards for dissent should be taken as a clear warning if ignored will possibly lead to a predictable outcome.

We also encourage team captains to intervene early, if they see things escalating and help guide players off the pitch before the situation for the player deteriorates further.

## **DISCIPLINARY FLOWCHART NOW AVAILABLE**

To help reduce the number of misconduct complaints and support clubs in resolving issues more effectively, we've introduced a new flowchart on the Disciplinary section of the SE website.

This tool is designed to guide clubs toward the most appropriate resolution pathway, ensuring that concerns are addressed at the right level and in the right way. We encourage all clubs to familiarise themselves with it and use it as a first step when considering how to handle on- or off-field incidents.
