

Annual Review 2025-26



Welcome to our fifth annual review and report to members of North West Hockey, and my final one as Chair of the Board. We have continued to deliver a wide range of hockey opportunities for all from juniors, schools, clubs, masters, outdoor, indoor and officiating through the work of our volunteers and committees in 2025-26. Like the challenges faced by Club's, we are limited in sometimes progressing our ambition and plans due to the limitations on volunteer time or vacancies. I'm very proud of what our NW volunteers, many of whom do multiple roles, have delivered in 2025-26. We have a fantastic opportunity to grow and develop hockey in the North West - but we need the help of more volunteers and clubs make hockey happen and start to make progress against our strategic objectives and delivering against our **Vision 'To promote, develop and grow hockey opportunities for all in the North West'**.

As I reflect on the past 6 years since North Hockey Ltd was formed and being elected Chair, the work put in to establish the new Area and bring together a number of hockey organisations has been tremendous – all done through our volunteers. We have brought together all aspects of hockey in the NW under one structure, and it's been really pleasing to see how we have grown the junior hockey programme for clubs and schools and now have over 600 players involved in NW Masters hockey, as well as out leagues, officiating and discipline management. I would like to thank everyone who has been involved from the Board, our Management Committee, and functional committees and support roles as well as from you our clubs, counties and volunteers we couldn't do it without you.

Our annual review gives a snap shot of the activities delivered through our NW team in 2025-26 and shares key highlights for the season. Whilst we have not progressed areas of work on our strategy as much as the Board would have liked, due the workload to run the core activities, it is an area the Board will take time to review with the incoming Board Chair and continue to take NW Hockey forward

Adult League and Competitions highlights 2025 -26

Items Brought forward from last year

- The league commenced in line with the EH centralised calendar but feedback from some clubs indicated they wanted a later start so **2026/7 will commence on 19 September** of Week 2 of the centralised calendar.
- Extreme weather guidelines introduced
- NW Premier Division trialled playing in quarters. This was successful and will be mandated in 2026/27. Thank you to the majority of clubs completing post-game feedback to allow this to be tracked
- Committee of 17 volunteers** run our North West Open/Men's and Women's Leagues covering:
 - 37 Divisions
 - 410+ Adult Teams entered the 2025/26 season. 9 Team withdrawals (11 in 24/25)
 - 4,000+ players across the NW Open/Men's divisions and 4,000 players across the NW Women's divisions
 - 4,500+ NW matches per season (152 walkovers)
 - 44 Development Teams (18 Open/Men's and 26 Women's).

Junior League and Competitions highlights 2025-26

Thanks to the incredible dedication of the committee members and wider hockey community, this season saw more junior hockey, more opportunities, and more players involved than ever before. From weekend leagues to vibrant school festivals, junior hockey across the North West is going from strength to strength - with including NW Junior Leagues, Development tournaments. Club and School Indoor, Area Schools finals, In2Hockey Area Finals, and an exciting expansion in State Schools engagement through our festivals kindly hosts by schools and clubs.

Charles Jackman took on the vacant role on chair at the end for 2025 and Tracy Sloane took over from Lou Nash as Junior Co-ordinator in January 2026.

CLUB COMPETITIONS NW Junior Area Leagues (U14 & U16) • 6 leagues • 28 teams (1 withdrawal) from 14 clubs • U16 Boys (5), U16 Girls (6) • U14 Boys (10), Girls (7) Finals took place in all the leagues, a change from last year and a great opportunity for all competitors. Whilst we increased the leagues from 5 to 6 to support clubs with travel distances, we have 4 fewer clubs entering and 10 fewer teams. A number of clubs are struggling with numbers to field a full squad and have joined with other clubs to enter the league. We want to support clubs to work together to try and form teams to enter to offer competitive hockey for U14 and U16's alongside EH Championship. We also hosted a successful Tier 4 7 a side U14 festival day at Sedbergh to support clubs with fewer player or developing player who don't enter the junior leagues. In2Hockey - NW Finals Day (U10 and U12's) Hosted for the first time in at the Armitage Centre in Manchester, with two full size pitches, this remains a special day in our NW junior calendar with County winners joining us along with Isle of Man teams. • U10 boys' winners / runners up: Bowdon & Lytham • U10 girls' winners / runners up: Bowdon & Fylde • U12 boys' winners / runners up: Alderley Edge & Brooklands • U12 girls' winners / runners up: Fylde & Wigton The U12 winners then competed at National Finals held at Nottingham. Young Umpires took centre stage too, with awards recognising future officiating stars -thanks to the leadership of Joy Elliot-Bowman and the county leads who gave opportunities for young umpires to develop their skills at area finals County Festivals – Pure Hockey Fun! Big thanks again to our counties who once again ran County festivals style tournament from U8s to U14s.	Junior Club Indoor Competitions Now an established part of our programme and winner go forward to national finals. Thanks to all involved in running the tournaments and especially our indoor officials. It was a repeat for last season with: • Bowdon HC dominated U16s (boys and girls) • And Brooklands HC wining both U18 titles SCHOOLS HOCKEY NW Area qualifiers tournaments produced finalists for EH National School Championships in: • In2Hockey (U13), • outdoor (U14 T2, U16 & U18 T3), • and indoor (U16 & U18) . In addition: U12 and U14 Indoor finals were also held - a great development to nurture early engagement with indoor hockey and prepare players for the upper age groups. Tier 2 competitions were offered across all age groups (In2 Hockey & Indoor), making sure every school, no matter what level they were at, had the chance to play competitive hockey. Area indoor finals were run for five school indoor competitions with Tier 1 winners going to national finals: • U16 Girls: Kings Chester • U16 Boys Tier 1: Manchester Grammar • U16 Boys Tier 2: Rossall school • U18 Girls: Manchester High School for Girls • U18 Boys: Kings Chester State Schools This season saw an uptake in the number of state schools entering area tournaments as part of EH state schools' competitions. We also ran a number of NW state schools' festivals with some great days of hockey, and we plan build on this momentum next season with state schools' festival finals day to be hosted at Deeside for the winners of each local festival tournaments. As a new team we are seeking volunteers to join the Junior Committee. More details coming soon!
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Masters highlights 2025-26

Despite bronze medal performances from the W60 and M65 teams, and competitive performances from a few others, we were poor overall and bottom by some distance of any table of compiled results across the age groups. The M70 and M75 (joint with YNE) groups did well to get teams out at all, and particular credit is due to the W65 team of which roughly half was made up of YNE players who did not get selected for YNE.

In terms of participation in Masters, though, we are doing well, gaining 100+ registrations on our Pitchero web site in each of the last 2 seasons.

The NW500 competition is partly responsible for this growth – it is running again this year with 3 mini-leagues and 5 clubs participating for the first time. Current registrations are shown in the table below; we now have over 600 players registered.

Congratulations also to the many NW Master's players representing England, Wales and Scotland in this years Masters World Cup and to those who played in the Indoor Masters World Cup.

It remains a huge challenge to get our best players out and playing in the elite 8 Area competitions. There are various possible explanations including:

- Congested fixtures with other competitions
- Conflict with family life (for younger age groups in particular)
- Poor organisation and communication of our activities
- Managers stepping up from smaller clubs, with whom elite players don't engage.

For next season we need some fresh thinking, for the mens' teams and the younger age groups in particular. We went to the M35 and M40 tournaments with squads of 10 and 12 respectively yet there must be hundreds of good players in these age groups eligible to play.

I would seriously consider not entering teams in these younger mens' competitions next season unless we can get leaders to step up for the age groups from bigger clubs, with a wider network of contacts among players at the top level.

Officiating highlights 2025-26

2025-26 was another challenging season, however, we managed to appoint to the majority of Open/Men's and Women's North West Adult League Premier Division Matches and to a range of Area and County tournaments, (adult and junior) including Indoor.

- **10 Umpires attained their level 2** and undertook occasional NW Adult League Premier Division appointments. NW Umpires also undertook 4 NPUA appointments (Regional Reserves) on EHL National League Matches.
- Manchester (Armitage) Tournament, September 2025, **31 umpires attended with 17 attaining their level 1**, 5 Umpires Coaches undertook development with **2 attaining their County Coaching Award**.
- **Young Umpires: 52 young umpires were added to this year's programme, 34 Young umpires officiated at the NW County In2Hockey Tournaments** in March, 25 Young umpires officiated at the NW In2Hockey Tournament in April. **6 Young umpires** were selected to officiate at National Tournaments.
- **Indoor:** All Schools Tier 1 competitions had both Umpires and Match Officials appointed. The Regional NW Tournament had all NW NPUA Umpires appointed
- **Technical Officials:** The 8 Area Masters Tournaments hosted by Timperley have been used for the development of Technical Officials and some Umpire development. 2 North West Technical Officials: Simon Allen and Jane Evans have undertaken and successfully passed their EHL Assessments.

Looking forward

We will be working with the England Hockey Officiating Working Group (OWG) to support the roll out of the **New Officiating Pathway** which incorporates the development of Umpire Coaches. We will be re-introducing hosting a number **Umpire Forums/Workshops** for the development of Officials at all levels across the area.

We will be reviewing our develop programmes/initiatives and Officiating Strategies to support and feed into the North West Hockey Strategy, and the England Hockey Officiating (EHO) plans.

Discipline Summary 2025-26

The headline in the North West is a similar one to the National Discipline picture. A trend upwards on the amount of red card and misconduct incidents.

At the end of any season the Discipline Report is often statistics heavy. As well as the incidents that form the below statistics any incidents that happen in National League matches or the final stages of national cup competitions are dealt with by an EH Discipline Panel. These panels are formed from the ADA of the area for the player involved and two other ADAs.

Next season sees the introduction of a reviewed set of regulations but also a document that will hope to standardise the actual sanctions given for offences both in the areas and nationally. It is hoped that this will include mitigating and aggravating factors on suspensions.

Instead of a National Discipline seminar, the discipline panels from all areas will be invited to some online training and discussion meeting to introduce the new regulations but also discuss best practice across the country.

My thanks, as always, goes to all members of the discipline panel for the work that they have done this past season but a special thank you needs to go to two of the ADAs who have been part of the discipline process for a long number of years as they were both originally county CDAs at the time that I was Cheshire CDA before becoming North RDA.

2025- 26 key Stats

48 Incidents:

- 2 "match day" reds from repeat minor yellow card offences.
- 6 Misconduct complaints that led to a suspension, (one pitch side urination automatic two weekend ban)
- 45 incidents that led to at least a 16 day suspension. Average suspension was 28 days
- 6 suspensions on a break over the summer to resume on 14th September. In the Monday before the scheduled restart of the League Season.
- One rejected appeal and one still being dealt with by EH Discipline appeal panel, this one had the suspension stayed while the appeal is being concluded.

North West Hockey Finance Report 2025-26

- **The Report to the Directors and Unaudited Finance Statement for the period 1st May 2025 to 30th April 2026** has been approved by the Board and will be shared at the AGM. This forms part of our statutory reporting to Companies House.
- Operating income for 2025-26 was generated through: Area Membership Fees, League and Competition Entry Fees, League fines and Appointed Umpire fees.
- Our total income and expenditure are up on 24/25, primarily due to income generated by Junior and Schools events. However, Leagues fines have increased which suggests that fines are not a deterrent and suggest the ALMC consider further.
- All monies raised from League fines are now transferred directly into the North West Hockey Growth Fund.
- A sum of approximately £26,500 has been set aside for the North West Hockey Growth Fund initiative, details of which are still being finalised.
- We are pleased to report that our investment in a paid Junior Events Coordinator role to support the breath of junior activity we run has made a big difference to what we can deliver. We continue to review roles and resources needed to support our volunteer roles and committees.
- To conclude, our finances are in a healthy state and that our reserves are approximately of £79,000. It is our intention to continue to use this reserve to support the NWH Growth Fund and other initiatives, such as umpire development.

He's made a major contribution to helping us set up robust, fit for purpose and well managed financial systems that are reflected our financial position. 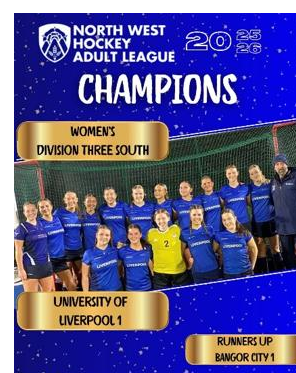
