BATTLE FOR THE CROWN

WOMEN'S FINALS PREVIEW

The four teams reaching this year's Premier Division Finals have emerged from a demanding campaign that saw Surbiton top the Final Top Six table unbeaten, with 14 wins from 16 and a league-leading 61 goals scored.

Hampstead & Westminster join them as runners-up of the league and toppers of Pool B after a strong league season built on 11 victories. Wimbledon secured their place by finishing fourth in the table and runners-up in Pool B, while Durham University are this season's fairytale story making their first appearance at this stage following promotion last year and a sixth-place finish in their debut Premier Division season.

The semi-finals bring two compelling match-ups – Hampstead & Westminster face Wimbledon in what history suggests could be a tight affair, while Surbiton meet Durham for the third time this season, having edged both league encounters. With proven finalists, rising challengers and contrasting routes to this weekend, the stage is set for two days of high-quality knockout hockey.

Hampstead & Westminster and Wimbledon meet in the opening semi-final after two tight, low-scoring contests during the regular season, both of which went Hampstead's way. Their first meeting in November was decided by a single moment, with Philippa Lewis scoring in the 29th minute to secure a 1-0 away win. It was a match shaped by narrow margins, with Hampstead taking one of the few clear chances created across a controlled defensive performance from both sides.

The return fixture in March followed a similar pattern, again finishing 1-0 to Hampstead. This time it was Lauren Hunt who struck in the closing stages, settling another closely contested match in which both sides worked hard to limit opportunities. Across the two games, Hampstead hold a 2-0 aggregate advantage, reflecting their ability to edge key phases in tight encounters.

Both teams arrive in strong form: Hampstead topped Pool B with three wins from three, while Wimbledon secured second place in Pool A. With two evenly matched league meetings behind them, this semi-final promises another competitive, disciplined contest with fine margins likely to decide who reaches Sunday's final.

Surbiton and Durham University meet in the second semi-final, following two closely contested league fixtures earlier in the season.

Their first meeting in November saw Surbiton edge a 3-2 win, overturning an early Durham lead created by two well-taken finishes from Lizzy Pocknell. Surbiton responded through Amy Costello's penalty corner before second-half goals from Erica Sanders – one from the spot and one from a corner – secured the points.

The return fixture in March followed a similar pattern, with Surbiton again winning by a single goal. Early strikes from Isabelle Yonge and Sanders gave them control, and although Katie Birch pulled one

back late on, Surbiton held firm for a 2-1 victory.

Surbiton arrive at Finals Weekend as the top-ranked side, unbeaten in the Final Top Six and with the league's strongest attacking record. They also carry added motivation after last year's 1-0 defeat to Reading in the final, a result they will be determined to put right in front of a large and partisan crowd. Durham, meanwhile, reach this stage for the first time following a resilient debut Premier Division campaign, and will look to challenge Surbiton with the energy and confidence that has defined their season.

A potential final between Surbiton and Wimbledon would bring together two sides who have already met three times this season, with Surbiton unbeaten across all encounters and Wimbledon one of only two teams to take points off the table-toppers.

Their first meeting, back in November, ended in a 0-0 draw – a tight, disciplined contest in which both teams defended well and clear chances were scarce meaning that both sides shared the points.

The second fixture, in April, followed a similar pattern for long spells. Wimbledon again restricted Surbiton effectively, but the league leaders found the breakthrough shortly after half-time when Erica Sanders finished to secure a 1-0 away win. It was another match shaped by defensive organisation on both sides, with Surbiton taking the one opportunity that mattered.

Their most recent meeting came in Pool A, and it was here that Surbiton produced their most decisive performance of the season against Wimbledon. Amy Costello opened the scoring from a penalty corner before Sanders added a second, and Darcy Bourne struck twice in the second half to secure a fine 4-0 victory.

Across the three fixtures, Surbiton hold a 5-0 aggregate advantage, but their league encounters have been tight and Wimbledon have shown

Durham University and Wimbledon would bring together two sides whose meetings this season have been defined by Wimbledon's control and Durham's determination to stay competitive in long spells.

Their first encounter in October was a tight affair, with Durham defending resolutely for much of the match before Wimbledon finally broke through early in the second half. Olivia Chilton's penalty-corner finish in the 46th minute proved the difference in a 1-0 away win, reflecting a contest shaped by discipline and limited chances.

The return fixture in March was far more decisive. Wimbledon produced one of their strongest attacking displays of the season, winning 5-0 with goals spread across the team. Becky Manton and Charlotte Watson struck early to establish momentum, before Pippa Lock added two well-taken finishes and Anna Toman converted from a penalty corner. Durham worked hard to stay in the contest but were unable to find a breakthrough against a Wimbledon side who defended with clarity and countered with purpose.

Durham, however, arrive at Finals Weekend having grown significantly across their debut Premier Division campaign, reaching this stage through resilience, improved consistency and a clear upward trajectory.

A final between these two sides would offer a

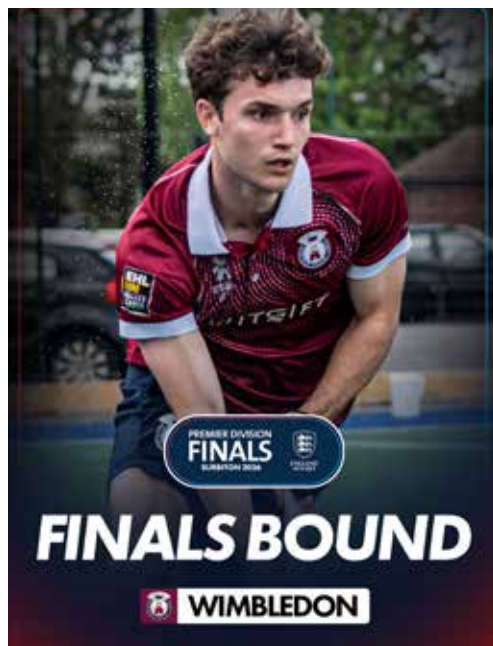
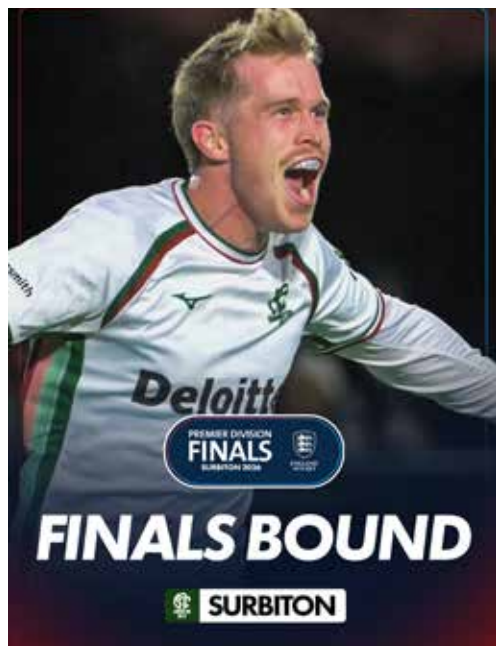
