


Dedicated support for all students

The University of Sheffield International College is a dedicated facility where international students come to prepare for the challenges of academic life.

A transformative learning space

Our College buildings are in the city centre, within walking distance of other University buildings and accommodation. You will be able to travel to and from the College easily and quickly. You will also be able to enjoy stunning views across the city from many classrooms.

College facilities include:

- **Over 65 classrooms** of varying size and layout to provide suitable settings for different classroom activities
- **Social study zones** for collaborating on group work
- **Meeting rooms** which are available for students to speak with teachers and support staff
- **The latest technology** including lecture capture facilities so classes with our expert academics can be easily recorded and reviewed
- A laboratory where **future scientists and engineers** can apply theory to experiments.

Be a part of a vibrant international community

Each year, over 2,000 students join the International College making us one of the largest pathway colleges in the UK. With students from all over the world, you will benefit from a multicultural environment – both inside and outside of the classroom.

The time you spend at the College allows you to study, network and make friends with other students from a wide range of backgrounds and cultures.

Employability as part of your programme

An extraordinary learning environment

At the University of Sheffield International College, we provide tailored programmes for our international students. In one year, we'll help you to:

- **Reach the academic level** you need in your chosen subject
- **Gain the study skills** and independent learning techniques that will be vital to your successful progression
- **Develop your English language skills** so you can express yourself clearly, take part in lessons, and get the most out of your studies
- **Adapt to the UK education model** by studying in a semester-based system, aligned closely to the University's own teaching style.

As an International College student you'll have access to the world-class facilities of the University of Sheffield.

We will teach you skills that will benefit your future studies and career. Above all, we'll give you the confidence that you will need to progress in your studies.

Small class sizes with experienced tutors

You will study in small classes with teachers experienced in helping students learn in a second language. With a combination of lectures, tutorials, workshops, seminars, interactive learning and independent study you will get to know a wide range of learning methods that you will experience at the University. Teachers will monitor your progress and support you to develop an appropriate pace of study and apply your skills. We will encourage you to build your competence in using academic English on a daily basis, and work collaboratively with staff and your fellow students.

Undergraduate degree options

The International Foundation Year is an intensive two semester programme designed specifically to provide you with a route to undergraduate degree study at the University.

This course includes academic subjects, study skills and English language preparation. It has been developed for international students and designed specifically to provide you with the skills and knowledge to succeed in your degree.

Your offer of entry will contain the level you need to achieve on your foundation year. Students who complete their foundation year and achieve the required grades are entitled to a place at the University.

Study structure

You can choose one of three foundation routes:

- Business, Social Sciences and Humanities

This will prepare you for an undergraduate degree in Arts, Humanities or Social Sciences, including those taught at the Management School and the School of Law, and many degrees in other departments.

- Science and Engineering

This will prepare you for an undergraduate degree in the Faculty of Engineering or Faculty of Science and a small number of degrees in other faculties.

- Dentistry

We work with the University's prestigious School of Clinical Dentistry to deliver a unique, purpose-built dentistry foundation programme.

This unique opportunity offers ambitious students a route to a five year Bachelor's degree in Dental Surgery at the University of Sheffield.

Within each of our programmes, we offer a choice of subject-specific pathways, allowing you to enjoy a programme of study based on your university goals.

English Language Preparation

If you need further language training before you start Foundation Year, you can join our intensive English language preparation programme.

This course is taught in partnership with the University's English Language Teaching Centre and is designed to improve your English language skills to the necessary level. At the end of your English language preparation programme you will start the International Foundation Year, providing you have achieved the required language level.

Progression degrees

The International Foundation Year leads to a wide range of progression degrees, subject to passing at the required level. These are listed on pages 15 and 16 and subject to change.

1.5 or 2 semesters

Age on entry

Students should be at least 17 years of age on entry to the International College.

Please note that some degrees require students to be aged 18 or over when they start their undergraduate studies.

Students wishing to study the Dentistry Foundation Programme must be aged 18 or over.

Business, Social Sciences and Humanities

This programme provides a route to a number of degrees in the humanities and social sciences, which include degrees taught at the Management School, the School of Law and Sheffield School of Architecture.

Your International Foundation Year will include a combination of academic subjects, study skills and English language preparation.

Your programme will be tailored to allow you to prepare for your chosen degree, studying the most relevant modules for your subject area.

Pathways

There is a choice of five pathways; each relevant to a selection of the progression degrees available:

- Architecture, Landscape & the Urban Environment
- Business, Management & Finance
- Economics
- Law & Criminology
- Social Sciences & Humanities.

Modules common to all pathways

- Academic English Skills
- Project Skills
- Academic Success (Personal Tutorials and Development Planning).

Modules specific to each pathway

- **Architecture, Landscape & the Urban Environment:**
Social Science, The Built Environment
- **Business, Management & Finance:**

International Foundation Year

Dentistry

This course provides route on to the University of Sheffield's prestigious five year Dental Surgery Bachelor's Degree.

Your programme will be tailored to prepare you for your chosen degree, studying the most relevant modules to your subject area. Some of the modules listed will be compulsory for progression on to specific degree programmes at the University.

Pathways

We work with the University's prestigious School of Clinical Dentistry to deliver a unique, purpose-built dentistry foundation programme.

Each year up to 10 ambitious students complete this programme and progress on to a five year Bachelor's degree in Dental Surgery at the University of Sheffield.

Modules

- Academic English Skills
- Project Skills
- Academic Success (Personal Tutorials and Development Planning)
- Biology
- Chemistry
- Dentistry modules (delivered at the School of Clinical Dentistry (TUOS).

University-style teaching

The University of Sheffield International College follows a semester format, introducing you to the academic schedule used at the University. You will follow the style of teaching that you will experience on your degree. You will take part in tutorials, seminars, lectures and laboratory work, which means that you will be well prepared for an undergraduate degree at the University.

Assessment

You will be assessed regularly throughout the course. Your development is monitored through continuous coursework and assessments at the end of each term or module, which may take the form of examinations. You will also need to complete a series of presentations and extended essays as part of your overall assessment. In addition, you will be expected to meet the following progression requirements:

- Completion of the Discover Dentistry MOOC
- Minimum 50% in School of Clinical Dentistry Enhancement Elements Assessment
- No 'red flag' outcomes in Situational Judgement Test (SJT)
- UCAT score above annual threshold set by the School of Clinical Dentistry.

Other criteria for entry on to a clinical programme

In order to progress on to the BDS degree you will need to meet health requirements in place at that time. This might include checking that you're not an infectious carrier of hepatitis B, hepatitis C or HIV and that you do not have tuberculosis. In order to complete your dental training in Sheffield you also need to demonstrate immunity to hepatitis B.


You will be required to undergo a Disclosure and Barring Service (DBS) Enhanced Disclosure check. If you have lived outside the UK in the last 5 years you will also need to provide a certificate of good conduct from your home country which confirms you do not have a criminal record.

When you undertake clinical training in NHS hospitals and dental practices you must adhere to local NHS policies including guidelines on behaviour and dress and the need to be "bare below the elbow".

The Pre-Masters programme at the University of Sheffield International College offers a path to postgraduate study for international students.

Postgraduate degree options

This course is an intensive 1.5 or 2 semester programme of academic subjects, study skills and English language preparation. It has been designed specifically to prepare you for taught masters study at the University.

This programme is for you if you do not meet the entry requirements for a masters degree, want to refresh your skills, or want to be better prepared for the style of study required during a UK masters degree. Once you successfully complete your Pre-Masters at the required level, you are entitled to entry to a relevant taught postgraduate degree programme.

Study structure

You can choose one of two Pre-Masters routes:

- Business, Social Sciences and Humanities

This will prepare you for a taught postgraduate degree in the Faculty of Social Sciences, including the School of Law, the Management School and Sheffield School of Architecture. It can also lead to degrees in the Faculty of Arts and Humanities, and other areas too.

- Science and Engineering

This will prepare you for a taught postgraduate degree in the Faculty of Engineering or Faculty of Science, and a small number of programmes in other Faculties, such as Medicine, Dentistry and Health.

Within each of our programmes, you can choose the subject-specific pathways most suitable to your progression degree for a programme of study based on your postgraduate degree goals.

Pre-Masters Language Preparation

The Pre-Masters programme at the University of Sheffield International College offers a path to postgraduate study for international students. If you need additional language training before you start your Pre-Masters, depending on your degree choice, you may be able to join our intensive English for Pre-Masters programme.

This is taught in partnership with the University's English Language Teaching Centre. The course will improve your English language skills to the necessary level and prepare you to take an IELTS exam in order to achieve the English requirement for the following semesters of study.

Progression degrees

The Pre-Masters leads to a wide range of progression degrees, subject to passing at the required level. These are subject to availability and may change at the University's discretion. 



Choosing your accommodation

Our highly qualified academic staff are experts in teaching students from across the world. You will have an academic tutor who will advise you on your strengths and areas of development throughout your programme.


