Montse Martínez Ferré is currently responsible for the Languages and Self-Access Learning section at the URV Language and Publications Service. Before joining the URV, she worked as an English teacher at the UAB Barcelona Tourism and Hotel Management School and served as an English counsellor at the Self-Access Learning Centre at the UAB. Her longstanding interest in both languages and culture inspired her to join the URV staff internationalisation team in 2019 through the SUCTI project, aimed at strengthening staff engagement in internationalisation processes. In 2023, the team received the Xavier López Vilar Award from the URV Council to design and develop SUCTI+, an online platform to share best practices in internationalisation at home.
