Born in Milan on June 26, 1968, Paolo Cesare Maldini made his début on January 20, 1985 aged 16 and retired in 2009 recording 92 appearances and scoring 33 goals with AC Milan's First Team. In the 1997/1998 season he was appointed Captain after Franco Baresi. During his iconic career as footballer, spanning twenty-five years all with the Rossoneri, Maldini won 26 trophies, including 5 UCL and 7 Scudetti.

Maldini made his debut for Italy in 1988 playing 14 years before retiring in 2002 with 126 caps and wearing the Captain's armband 74 times. He also holds the record of minutes played by a footballer during FIFA World Cups: 2216 minutes in 4 editions of the tournament.

Paolo Cesare Maldini was appointed AC Milan Sporting Strategy and Development Director in 2018, before taking the task of Technical Director in June 2019.
