Open to anyone with an interest in the tax profession, CTA qualification is accessible to everyone. There is no requirement to have a prior qualification, however, the examinations are of a high standard and to give yourself the best chance of success, we recommend you register for the Tax Pathway route to qualification if you do not hold a previous qualification in accounting or law. Flexible and accessible learning

To gain the CTA qualification and become a member of the CIOT, students must sit and pass four tax papers, three Computer Based Examinations (CBEs) and have three years of practical experience in a tax environment. Some limited exemptions may apply depending on prior qualifications.

There are four tax exams	There are three one-hour CBEs
One Awareness	Professional Responsibilities and Ethics
Two Advanced Technical	Law
One Application and Professional skills	Principles of Accounting



With a modular exam structure, the CTA is designed to be as flexible as possible. The learning is delivered through a combination of taught classes, distance learning, online tuition, and revision courses for the examinations.

Choose a CTA route that is right for you

CIOT offers four different routes to membership. Choose a CTA route that is right for you, where you are in your tax career, where you want to go and how quickly you want to get there.

ACA CTA Joint Programme

The CIOT and ICAEW have created a Joint Programme that enables students to achieve two Chartered qualifications. The CTA qualification and the ICAEW Chartered accountancy qualification (ACA).

This Joint Programme helps students qualify in three to four years once they have undertaken relevant professional work experience.

Direct CTA Route

Access to the CTA qualification is open to anyone and there is no need to hold a prior qualification. However, if a student does not hold a qualification in accountancy or law we strongly recommend registering for the Tax Pathway. This will give students the best chance of success.

ATT CTA Tax Pathway

This route is ideal for new students wishing to study tax who do not come from an accountancy background.

The ATT CTA Tax Pathway offers a streamlined and efficient route to membership of both the Association of Taxation Technicians and the Chartered Institute of Taxation. This route offers greater flexibility in the choice of papers with the opportunity to specialise in a particular area of tax at an early stage, rather than the ATT compulsory papers in the traditional sequential route of ATT and then CTA. Students are also exempt from one paper.

CA CTA Joint Programme

The CIOT and Institute of Chartered Accountants of Scotland (ICAS) have entered into a partnership that enables students to achieve two Chartered qualifications. The CTA qualification and the ICAS Chartered accountancy qualification (CA). This Joint Programme helps students qualify in three to four years once they have undertaken relevant professional work experience.

CTA Examination Framework

Students can build an individual learning route that is relevant to their current role and responsibilities. This means they can choose examinations relevant to their role and specialise in specific areas of taxation as they progress within the organisation. Some students may be exempt from one or more examinations depending on prior qualifications. Typewritten examinations are held in May and November each year at examination centres around the UK.

COMPUTER BASED EXAMINATIONS

The aim of the Computer Based Examinations (CBE) is to test a candidate's knowledge of Law, Principles of Accounting and Professional Responsibilities and Ethics within the relevant areas of tax.

AWARENESS

The aim of the Awareness Paper is to examine core areas of tax which may fall outside of the student's direct remit. The examination covers five modules. Candidates choose three modules and will need to sit all chosen modules at the same sitting. (These modules will need to differ from the Advanced Technical choices.)

ADVANCED TECHNICAL

The aim of the Advanced Technical papers is to test the depth of a candidate's knowledge within the various areas of taxation at an advanced level. Each Advanced Technical paper is a "stand-alone" paper. Students will choose two papers from the choice of seven and they will be required to answer all questions set.

APPLICATION AND PROFESSIONAL SKILLS

The aim of the **Application and Professional Skills** paper is to test that the candidate has the necessary skills and expertise expected of a Chartered Tax Adviser. This is by means of a tax based case study. Candidates will choose one of five case study questions at the time they register for the written paper. Pre-seen information will be sent two weeks before the examination takes place.

- Principles of Accounting
- Law
- Professional Responsibilities & Ethics

CHOOSE THREE MODULES*

Three hours and fifteen minutes in length

- Taxation of Individuals
- Inheritance Tax, Trusts & Estates
- Taxation of Unincorporated Businesses
- VAT including Stamp
- Corporation Tax

The Awareness modules chosen must not be the same as the corresponding Advanced Technical papers

CHOOSE TWO PAPERS

Three hours and thirty minutes in length

- Taxation of Owner-Managed Businesses
- Domestic Indirect Taxation
- Cross-Border Indirect Taxation

- Human Capital Taxes

The Advanced Technical papers chosen must not be the same as the corresponding Awareness modules

Exemptions

Students who have passed the full examination requirements from other specified professional bodies can apply for exemptions. Students must apply for an exemption before the closing date of their last tax exam. There is no expiry date for exemptions, and there is an exemption fee. Get started on the CTA programme

To become a CTA student, start the application online at **www.tax.org.uk/studentregistration**

- Students must be registered for at least four months before they are permitted to enter for an examination.
- Examination entry is a separate application process.
- Register as a student by the last day of December, in order to enter for the May examinations by the last day of February.
- Register as a student by the last day of June, in order to enter for the November examinations by the last day of August.
- The registration period lasts three years (or four years for the ACA CTA and CA CTA Joint Programme and five years for Tax Pathway).
- Contact a tuition provider to start your learning journey.

Become a CIOT member

Membership of the CIOT is by examination; students need to pass the Chartered Tax Adviser (CTA) qualification and complete three years relevant professional experience. Once your application to membership is approved you will become a member of the Chartered Institute of Taxation.
