

## Schedule for students missing *Developmental Psychology* (6 EC)

Your study delay will be ½ year. The entry requirement for the second year course Practical Training: Psychological Research (PT:PR) is: having passed all first year courses. Therefore, PT:PR needs to be postponed to 2026-2027.

Priority needs to be given to first year courses and second year courses that constitute an entry requirement for starting your specialisation courses in the second semester.
