



Schedule of student council elections for Student Council (SR), Central Student Council (CSR) and programme committees – spring 2023

Monday 6 February	Reference date for voter eligibility (Art. 10, paragraph 2)
Monday 13 through Monday 20 February	Opening of the electoral register (electronic, login using UvA/VUnetID, Art. 11, paragraph 1) Period to submit amendment requests to the Central Voting Office (Art. 12, paragraph 1)
Monday 20 through Friday 24 February	Central Voting Office decides on requests for amendment and makes changes where necessary (Art. 12, paragraph 3)
Monday 27 February	Central Voting Office finalises electoral register (Art. 12, paragraph 5)
Tuesday 28 February through Friday 3 March	Period for submitting objections (Art. 52)
Monday 6 March	Handling of objections
Monday 3 through Tuesday 11 April	Nomination of candidates
Thursday 13 April	Opportunity to correct omissions (Art. 23, paragraph 1)
Monday 17 April	Public meeting of the Central Voting Office to finalise candidate lists (Art. 24, paragraph 1), 16:00, Maagdenhuis, Room 21
Tuesday 18 April	Finalised candidate lists made available for inspection (Art. 30, paragraph 2)
Tuesday 18 April through Friday 21 April	Period for submitting objections (Art. 52)
Wednesday 26 April	Handling of objections
Monday 8 through Friday 12 May	ELECTION PERIOD
Monday 22 May	Public meeting of the Central Voting Office to finalise results (Art. 39, paragraph 1), 15:00 – 15:30, followed at 16:00 by festive announcement of results by Rector Magnificus (more information later)

Appointment of a member of the Student Council for a seat on the Central Student Council (designation of member to be delegated)

No later than 09:00 on Friday 16 June 2023, the chairperson of the Faculty Student Council shall inform the Central Voting Office which member will represent the Student Council in the Central Student Council. This deadline also applies to councils that choose not to put forth a delegate (this often applies to the Student Council at the Faculty of Dentistry). As soon as it is known that a seat in the Central Student Council will not be occupied by one or more delegates, the Central Voting Office can decide which party will be allocated the resulting residual seat (according to the standard for the allocation of residual seats, i.e. the party that obtained the most votes on average per seat).
