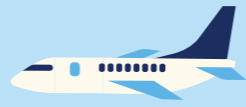

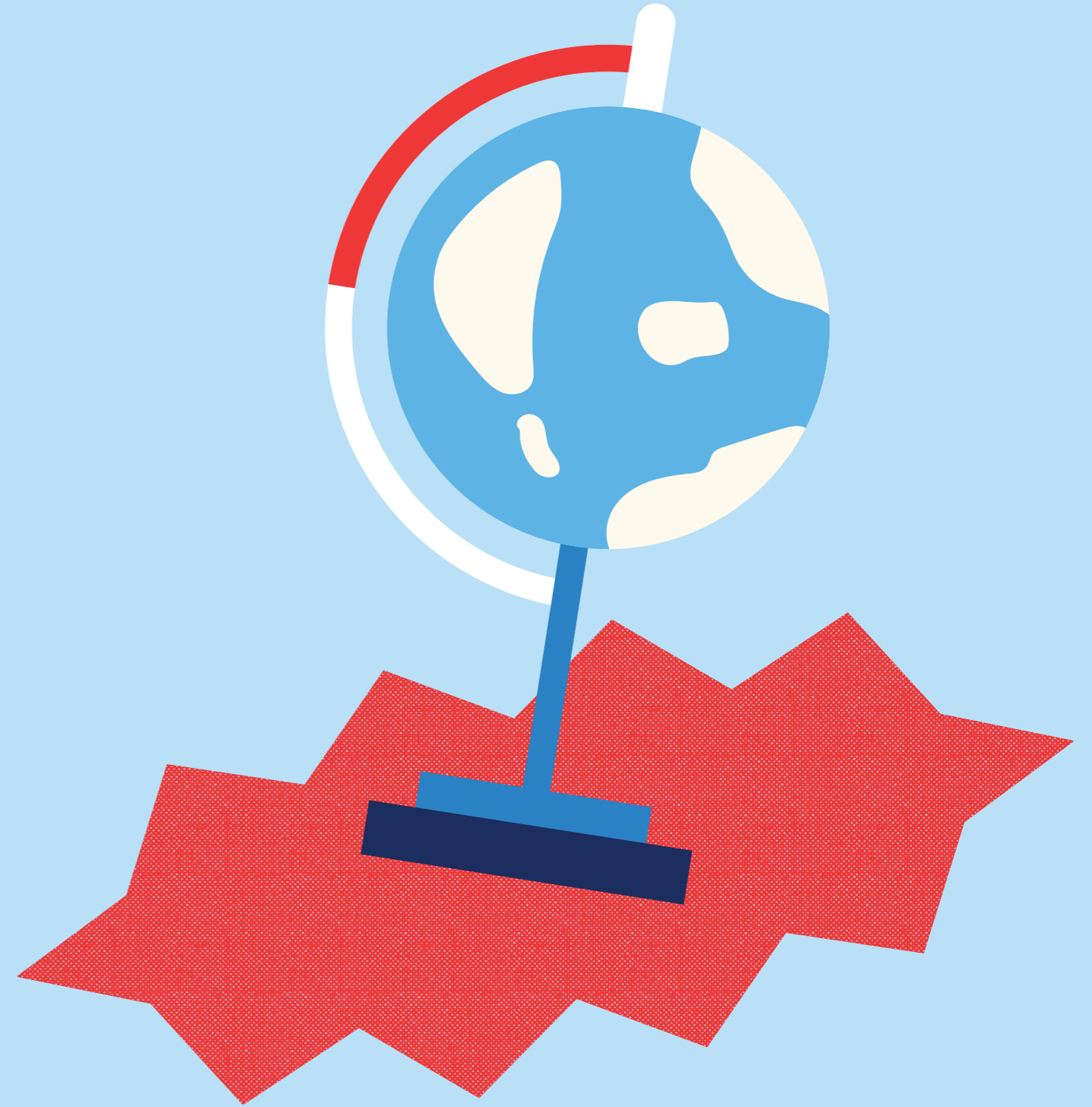

Face-to-Face

The **INCiTE Summer School** is a partnership between four world-class research institutions: The University of Edinburgh, University of Amsterdam, Nanyang Technological University, Singapore and The University of Sydney. The Year 2023 programme will be hosted by the National University of Management in Phnom Penh, Cambodia.

The global workplace is changing rapidly, and higher education must adapt to provide students with the necessary skills and experience to succeed. The INCiTE Summer School exposes students to the practice of Entrepreneurship, Design and Systems Thinking, and Intercultural Competence through engaging with real global challenges and building business models that can offer practical solutions in the form of a product, service or entity. Participants will acquire entrepreneurial skills, business awareness, and intercultural competencies that can be applied in local, national, and global settings.

GLOBAL STUDENT TEAMS

At the beginning of the summer school, students will be placed into multicultural, interdisciplinary teams of 4 to 6 students from the respective INCiTE institutions. Each team will take on real-life challenges faced in Cambodia and come up with innovative solutions to build a solution-oriented business model from the ground up.

COURSEWORK

During the couple of weeks, students will be studying coursework on Entrepreneurship, Design and Systems Thinking and Intercultural Competence. The coursework and assessments on these topics are designed to support teams to solve their Global Challenge task.

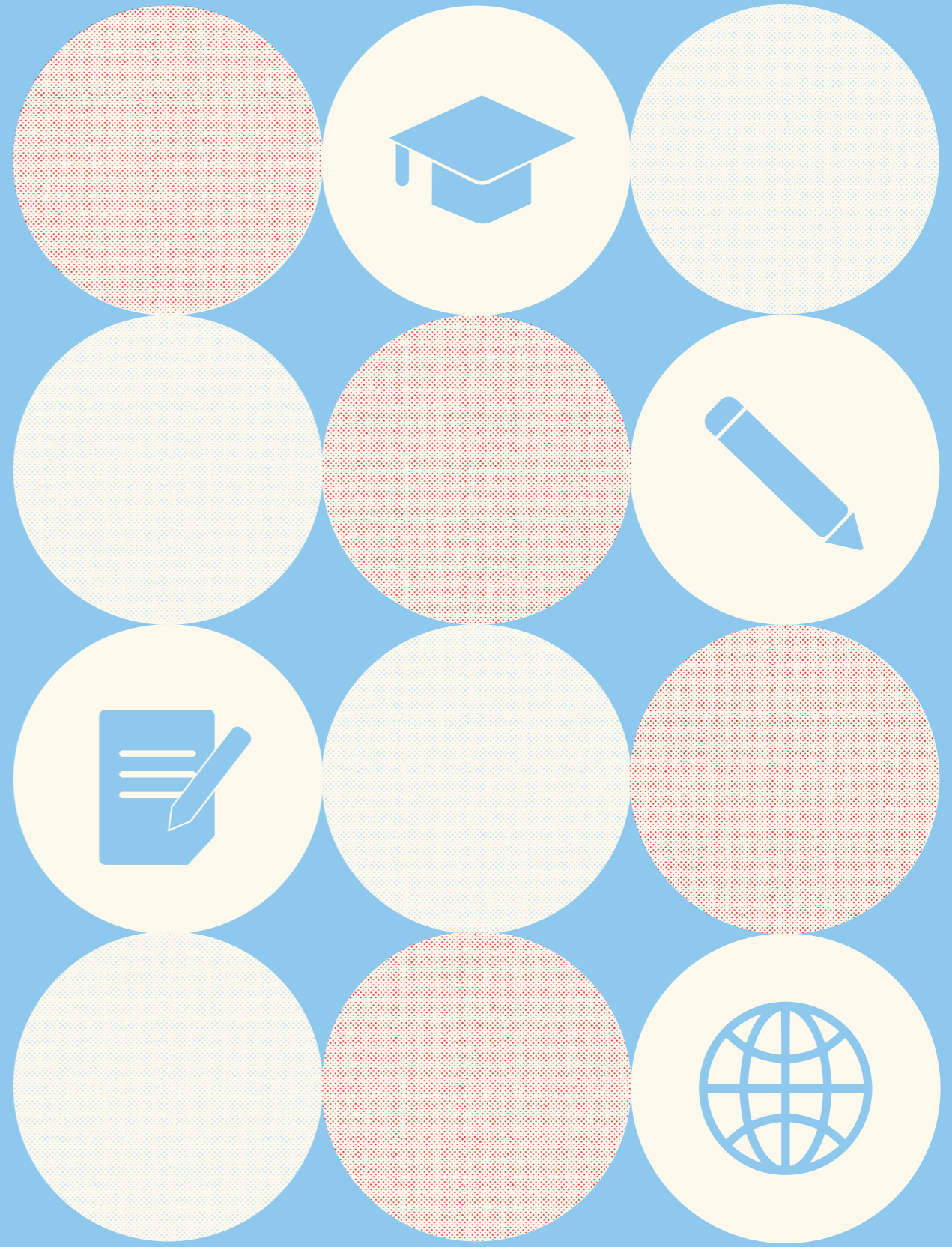

About this Module

2. Learn to visualise systems and understand how to apply design thinking to build suitable systems.

Learning Outcomes & Assessment

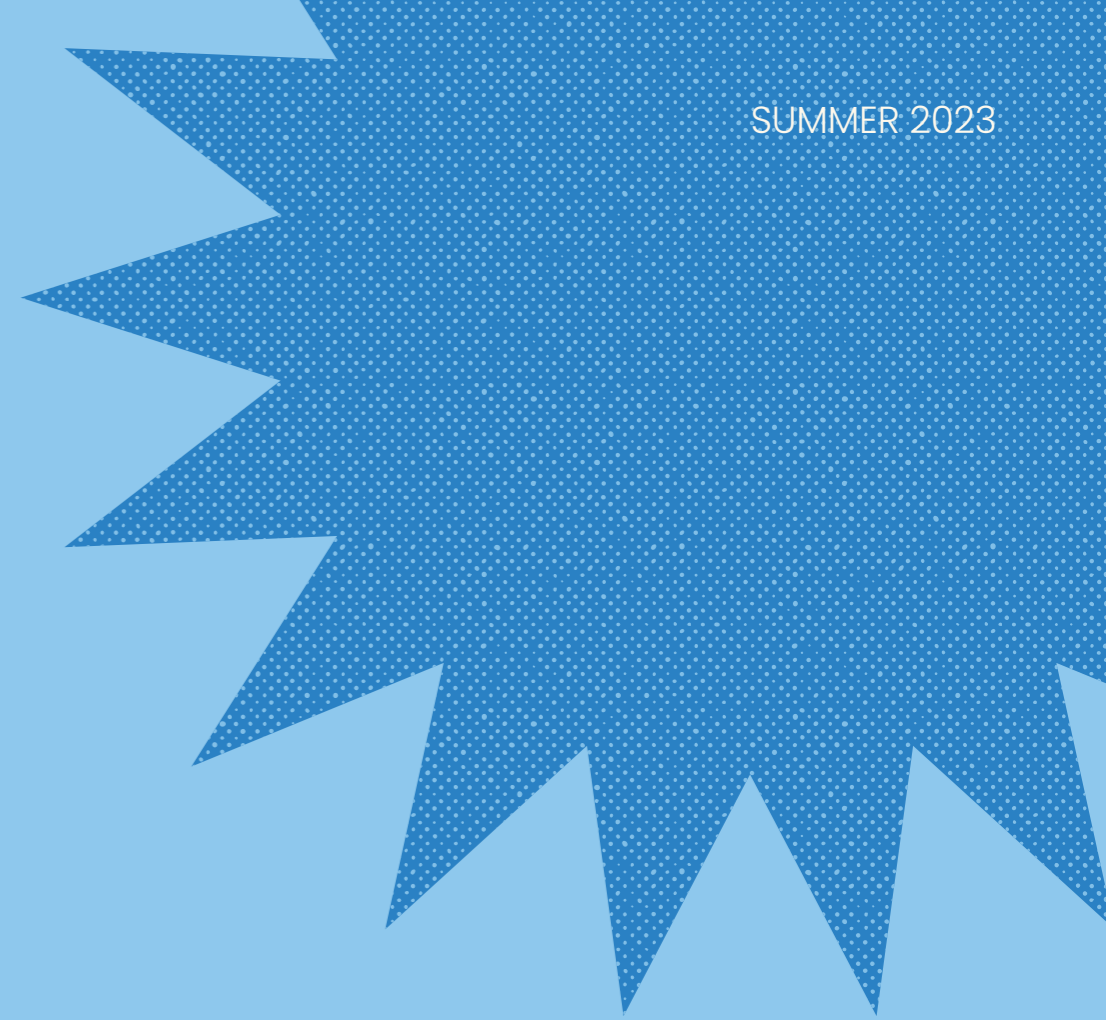
By the end of this course, students would be able to work effectively in a multidisciplinary and multicultural team.

Out of work, she can be found hillwalking and is also a keen sailor with her RYA Yachtmaster.



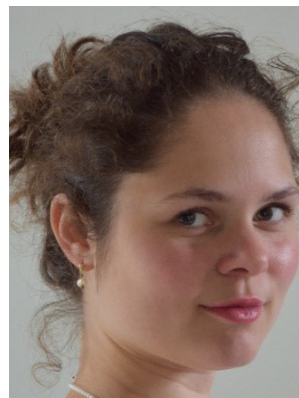

Most days will involve 4 hours of classes – 2 hours in the morning and 2 hours in the afternoon, with a 2-hour lunch break between the classes. Time will also be allocated for students to work in their teams or to participate in socio-cultural activities or industry visits/talks.

The detailed programme schedule will be circulated to all participants at least one week prior to the start of the INCiTE Summer School. The most up-to-date schedule will be available in the "Files" tab of the General channel in MS Teams.

Class Venue

Majority of the classes and activities will be held in Building A and B of the National University of Management (NUM). The specific location of your daily classes will be communicated to you closer to the date.

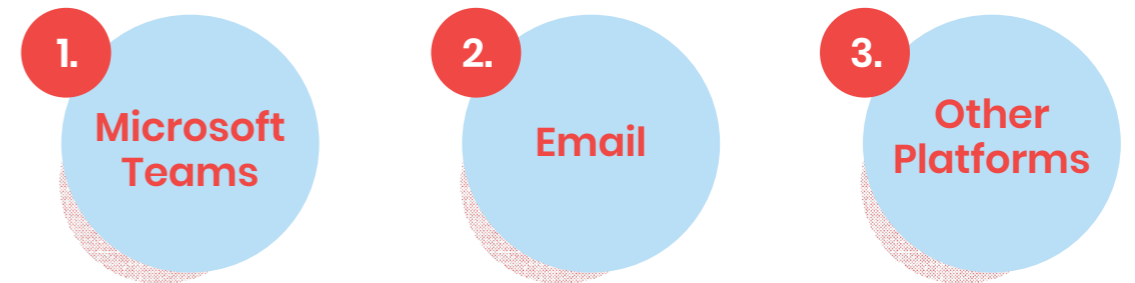
Reading Materials and Learning Resources

The INCiTE team has created folders in the "Files" tab of the Academic Matters channel in MS Teams for the faculty to store the reading materials and learning resources. You may refer to the course folders in MS Teams for your study and reference.

For your individual student team, you are also encouraged to store and share your work in the "Files" tab of your student team's private channel.

Communication Channels

The INCiTE Summer School will use the following channels for daily communication with students, faculty and staff, hence you should have proficient knowledge on how to use these applications. This table describes how these systems will be used.



MS Teams for short, is a collaboration app that allows teams to have online meetings and share documents.

All official announcements and updates for the INCiTE programme will be issued through this platform; it will be the primary method of communication between the faculty and participants and will also serve as storage space for shared resources.

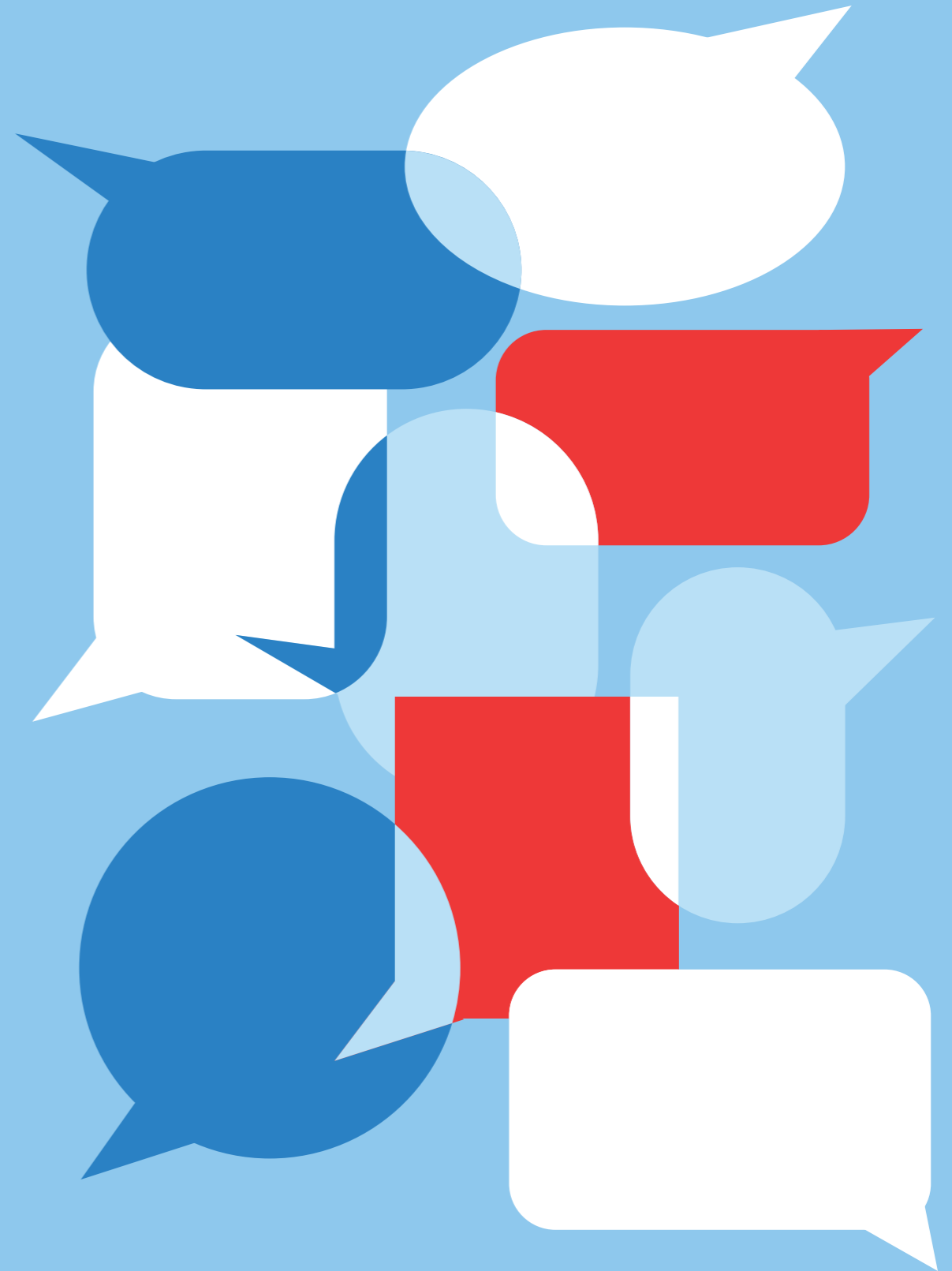
Your academic leader and faculty may also use email to communicate frequent updates to your institution email account so be sure to check it regularly.

Your team and other students are welcome to independently use other communication tools (eg. WhatsApp, Telegram, LINE, KakaoTalk etc.) for your group communication. Nevertheless, MS Teams will remain as the primary communication tool between the INCiTE staff and participants for the purposes of the academic and social programmes.





Roles and Responsibilities



Students enrolled in the INCiTE Summer School are held to a high standard of behaviour. While enrolled in the INCiTE Summer School, you are expected to **comply with behavioural expectations and the code of conduct when in Phnom Penh, Cambodia.**



Be respectful towards staff and other students

All students are required to treat staff and other students with respect. The INCiTE team will not tolerate any discriminatory language or behaviour, harassment or bullying of other students. Treat others how you would like to be treated!

Additionally, you should not disclose personal information or the information of any other member of the INCiTE Summer School online.



Be engaged and keep to time

All students are required to practice good attendance, which includes attending all mandatory sessions on time and participate fully throughout the entirety of the summer school.

Students are expected to engage with their teammates and work on their global challenge solution outside of live teaching hours. Full engagement is crucial not only for your academic benefit but also for the progress and dynamics of your team. Please do your best to meet timelines, commitments and due dates. Your team is relying on you!



Be punctual for class

Students should arrive at least five minutes before the scheduled class time and prepare for the session. Please be reminded to be early so as not to disrupt the class.

As you will probably be on a different schedule than you are used to, do remember to do the proper time conversions so you can attend classes on time. Students can also consider using a calendar application to set additional alarm or other tools to help you be punctual.



Respect the privacy of the class

Students are not allowed to record the classes whether it be video recording, audio recording or screen recording. They are also not allowed to take a screenshot of the content, faculty or a peer without receiving prior consent.



Practise good etiquette

MS Teams Etiquette

The INCiTE team has set up a collaborative space in MS Teams as a single-point access for conversations, learning content and tasks for the Summer School. Apart from the three main public channels, there are private channels set up for the individual institutions and student teams.

To keep the site clean and information well-organised for everyone to have a productive MS Teams experience,

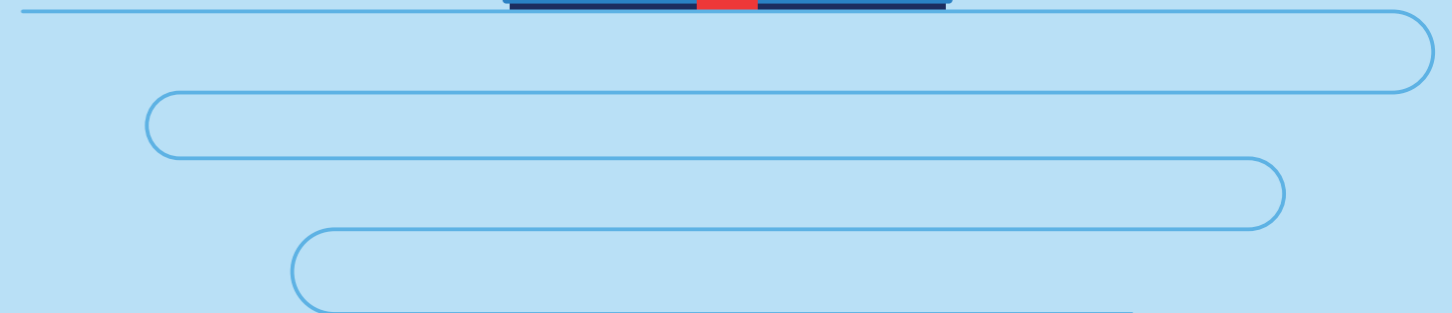
- Do not spam content and messages in any of the INCiTE Summer School channels.
- Do not forward or post any content not directly associated with your learning and discussions.
- Within your student team, you may want to take advantage of the ability to co-edit documents in the Files tab of your team's channel so everyone always has the most up-to-date version of your files.
- Do not video or audio call other members of the INCiTE Summer School without advance notice. You should pre-arrange meeting times with your teammates, other students and/or staff.

3-min Relaxation

Relax + Breathe:

1. Stand or sit in a comfortable position.
2. Drop your shoulders + let your jaw relax.
3. Breathe in slowly through your nose and hold your breath for 3s. Keep your shoulders down + allow your stomach to expand as you breathe in.
4. Now, exhale slowly through your mouth + relax your body.
5. Repeat Steps 3 + 4 for 3 times.

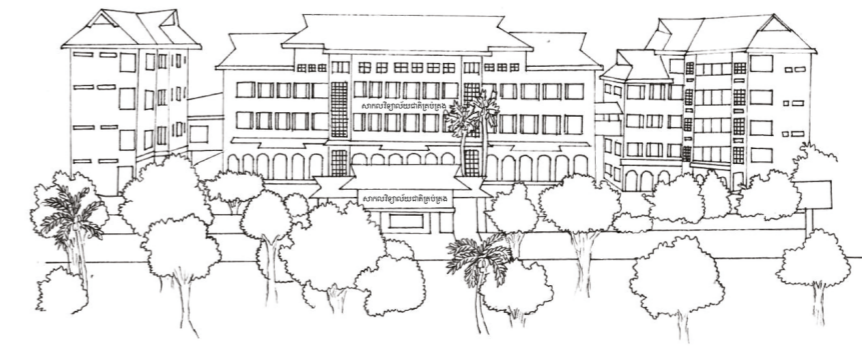

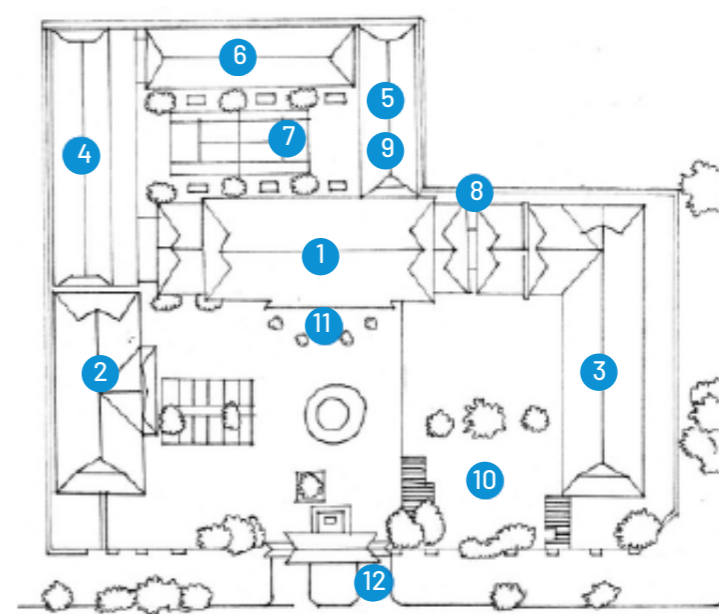
