

## **GENERAL**

### **FREIGHTS**

- On **sea freight**, congestion, labor shortages, lack of empty containers, rollovers & rockethigh spot rates have become part of our day-to-day. Our strategy remains to **persevere** on bookings and **anticipate** shipments as much as possible.
- On inland freight, truck availability is becoming limited again in Europe. This is caused by a mixture of factors, including an overall increase of coronavirus infections and uncertainty of new measures upon vaccination across the borders, plus summer holidays and increased demand due to sea freight problematics (increase of crossborder traffic).

## **LATIN AMERICA**

## BRAZIL

- A recent truckers strike in isolated points of Santos port region has blocked main roads and loading terminal entries. Truckers are striking for lower toll taxes and diesel oil costs reductions.
- Port activity in Santos/SP and Rio de Janeiro continues uninterrupted. However, shippers are facing some issues related to container shortage and cargo rollovers caused by to global demand disruptions.
- Due to delay on vessels operation, the port of Vitoria/ES is currently one of the most difficult ports to work with in terms of container release, container handling at terminal and vessel re-scheduling. Obtaining bookings is very difficult, with some shipping lines refusing to take any at all, and others accepting only a small portion and failing to release 20-feet containers in time.
- Bookings to Americas are particularly unlikely to be confirmed, and spot ocean freight rates are at highest level ever seen before.

#### **COLOMBIA**

- **Strike** in Colombia is on pause but there is still concern that there will be a recurrence as the protestors haven't reached an agreement with the government. In the meantime, Buenaventura is operating again at full capacity.
- In terms of **space allocation**, shipping lines are not offering more spaces for FH August from Buenaventura. On the other hand, Cartagena and Santa Marta are working normally; space availability is open.

#### **OTHER**

We have faced several booking rejections from Peru, but we persist in trials.

### **EAST AFRICA**

# **UGANDA**, RWANDA & KENYA

- Uganda is a daily challenge: **inland transit time** has increased due to Covid lockdown (slower documentation) and lack of performance on vessel schedules in Mombasa.
- In Rwanda, containers are scarce in Kigali for all shipping lines, but an early projection helps.
- In Kenya, the situation remains **normal** for both collecting empties and placing bookings.

#### **TANZANIA**

- Some shortage of empty containers is being faced, and there is no space available with some carriers, while others are underperforming in terms of vessel schedule & availability.
- **Port situation:** Dar es Salaam operation remains **normal**. Vessels take 8-11 days from ETA to berthing

### **ETHIOPIA**

• We are facing an **extremely difficult situation** in terms of container availability and vessel space in Ethiopia, which will result in shipment delays.

### **BURUNDI**

• The new season has started. **Shipments may start** within August.

### **ASIA**

 Space allocation remains a challenge across the region, especially for shipments to the Mediterranean and North America, which are extremely likely to be rejected or experience significant delays.

## **CHINA**

- Southern China is still dealing with port congestions & reduced labor (impact on ports of Yiantian & Shekou).
- Though there are signals of improvement, this situation could have a bigger impact than the **Suez Canal incident**.

## INDONESIA

- The low volume of imports has resulted in **container shortage** for exports.
- Limited availability of feeders has slowed down the overall port operation.

# **VIETNAM**

 Cat Lai, biggest port in Vietnam has shortened exports free time, and is not allowing early drop off, while vessels continue to delay and roll bookings. This makes the shipment planning much more challenging.
