



# What is a visual story?




# The Hidden Disabilities Sunflower Lanyards

# Commbank Stadium supports and recognises the Hidden Disability Sunflower

The Sunflower is a globally recognised symbol for Hidden Disabilities. The lanyard is a way that people with Hidden Disabilities can indicate to staff that they may need extra support, time, and understanding. There will be a limited number of lanyards available at the stadium.

It is OK if I don't have a lanyard, I can still get help if I need. If I already have a Sunflower lanyard I can bring it with me.

### Toilets and changing facilities

- Accessible toilets are located throughout the stadium.
- A Changing Place is located adjacent to Gate C and can be accessed from the Level 1 concourse and also external to the Stadium.



### Mobility and wheelchair access

- The stadium has ramps, lifts, and wide pathways for wheelchair users.
- Accessible seating is available, check with the ticket provider.

- Lift access to all upper floors in the Western Stand (Levels 2 to 4) is available internally at Gate F.
- Lift access is available for patrons ticketed to Gate A who may require assistance with the stairs up to the Level 1 concourse entry.



### Hidden Disabilities Sunflower lanyard

- The stadium supports the Hidden
   Disabilities Sunflower Program.
- Staff are trained to assist guests wearing a **Sunflower Lanyard**.



### Auslan and language support

(Available for some events only)

- Some concerts offer Auslan interpreters.
- Extra language support may be available if requested.

### Gates




At the gate, I will tell the **staff** if I need help. They will help me get to the **seat** using the lift.

# Arena floor




All gates have an accessible entrance. I will use the gate on my ticket to get to my seating.

### Lifts




If I have seats on Levels **2-4**, I can use the **lift** after I enter from Gate F or Gate A who may require assistance with the stairs up to the Level 1 concourse entry.


### Sunscreen

Jacket or poncho or umbrella



### Rules




### **Entry & Security**

- I will enter only through the gate on my ticket.
- All people entering the venue must hold a ticket.
- Security checks and bag screening are required.
- I will not bring large bags (A3 size max).



### **Venue Facilities**

- Food, bars, and toilets are available.
- There are free drinking water stations.
- I can only **smoke/vape** in **designated areas**.
- The venue is **cashless** there are **no ATMs**.



### **Concert Etiquette**

- I will dance safely.
- I will sing at a reasonable volume (not shout).
- I will not stand on seats, crowd surf, or mosh.
- I will not block views or use offensive language.



### Weather

- The event runs rain or shine – I will bring a poncho.
- I will plan ahead and check transport and security rules.
- I will visit the Commbank
   Stadium website for details.

### Food & Drink

# Food & drink options at the Stadium

- I will need to bring an Eftpos card or make mobile payments on my phone because all stores inside the stadium are cashless.
- I can buy food inside the stadium.
   There are a variety of food and drink stands. I can see the full menu and dietary options on the Commbank
   Stadium website.
- Options include gluten-free, halal, vegan, and vegetarian meals.

# Where can I eat & drink?


• I can eat or drink any food I purchase inside the stadium at designated seating near the restaurants or at my seat in the stands.

# Bringing your own food & drink

- I can bring a refillable water bottle (no metal, glass and aluminium).
- I can not bring my own food, except for medical or dietary needs. I can not bring outside alcoholic beverages or glass containers.




### Booking tickets and pricing



## How to book tickets

- I will buy my ticket online from Ticketek.
- I will download my ticket on the Ticketek app or add it to my phone wallet.



### Ticket costs & fees


- Ticket prices change depending on the event – I will check the <u>event page</u> for details.
- Service fees may apply, like transaction or delivery fees.



### Refund policy


- All sales are final I can only get a refund if the event is cancelled.
- I will not get a refund or exchange if I change my mind.





- Accessible seating is available for wheelchair users and other disabilities.
- Companion Cards are accepted –
   I will book through the accessibility team.



### **Additional Fees**

- No print-at-home fees tickets are mobile only.
- Late booking fees may apply.
- I can visit the <u>Commbank Stadium</u> website for full ticketing terms and conditions.





I can book an accessible car park at CommBank Stadium.

A small number of accessible parking spaces are available in the Stadium's northern car park on event days.

I need to book my accessible parking space online. Bookings usually open ten days before each event.

When I book, I need to give my Mobility Parking Scheme permit number. This is to check that I have a valid permit.

Accessible parking spaces are limited, so bookings depend on what is available.

I can visit the Stadium's website to submit an accessible parking request.




I can be dropped off or picked up at CommBank Stadium.

There is a special drop-off and pick-up area for people with mobility or accessible needs.
This is next to the Stadium entry, along the **Gate 1 service road**.

Sometimes, after big events,
O'Connell Street may be
closed for up to 30 minutes.

If this happens, I won't be able to access the Gate 1 service road until O'Connell Street reopens. I can check the event details or ask staff if I need more information on the day.




I can catch a bus to CommBank Stadium.

All public buses to Parramatta are fully accessible. I can catch a bus to Parramatta Interchange (near Parramatta Station). From there, I can catch another bus to CommBank Stadium.

When there's a big event, extra buses help people get to and from the Stadium.

I can visit **transportnsw.info** to plan my bus trip and check the times.




I can catch a train to CommBank Stadium.

Sydney Trains run often to Parramatta Station.

All Sydney Trains are fully accessible. This means I can use them if I have a wheelchair, mobility aid, or pram.

When there's a big event, extra train services help people get to and from Parramatta.

I can visit **transportnsw.info** to plan my train trip and check the times.



### When we arrive

Making my entry easy & stress-free. Arriving at a big venue can feel overwhelming. Here's what to expect when I arrive.

### What should I do first?

- I will enter through the gate listed on my ticket.
- There will be security checks and bag screening before I go in.
- If I have any restricted items, I can leave them in the cloakroom (if available).

### How long will it take?

- Entry times depend on the crowd, but security and ticket scanning usually take a few minutes.
- If it is a popular event I expect to cue for longer.
   I can use headphones, my device and stim tools if it's helpful to reduce overwhelm.

# Accessibility lanes & navigation

- There are special entry lanes for wheelchair users and people who need extra support.
- I can follow signs to find my seat, toilets, food outlets, and help points.

### Suggested path routes

- I can use the signs and ask staff for help if I need directions.
- If I want to plan ahead, I can check the Commbank Stadium website for maps and more details.

# Sequence of events My Journey from Start to Finish



### 1. Arrival and entry

- I will enter through the gate listed on my ticket.
- Security checks and bag screening will take place when I arrive.
- If I need to go on the **arena floor**, I will be given a **wristband**.



### 3. Event Experience


- The event will **start at the scheduled time**, and I can check my ticket or event info for details.
- I can buy food and drinks at special places around the venue.
- If I need accessible seating or services, they will be there for me.



- I might hear **loud music, crowd noise**, and see **bright lights**.
- Sometimes there might be **fireworks or special effects**, like fireworks at 9pm.
- If I need a break, I can go to the Quiet Room.

### 2. Navigating the venue


- I can follow signs and ask staff to help me find my seat, food outlets, toilets, and accessible facilities.
- If I need a break, there are quiet areas and sensory-friendly spaces I can use.



### 5. Exiting and getting home

- I will follow **staff instructions** to leave safely.
- I can use public transport or rideshare services to get home.
- If I want a quieter way to leave, I can wait in a designated space until it's less busy.

### **Event closing & exit process**


- The event will finish at the planned time, but I know delays might happen.
- I can **follow staff directions** to find the quickest and safest way to leave.
- Exits will be clearly marked marked and staff will help manage the crowds.



### **Public transport options**

- After big events, I might be able to catch extra trains, buses, or ferries.
- I can check the Transport NSW website for live updates on times and any delays.
- I can check the **Commbank Stadium website**.

### Getting home/leaving Getting Home – End of Event Information



### Parking & rideshare

- I know traffic can be busy when everyone leaves, so I might need to allow **extra time**.
- I can **pre-book a taxi or rideshare** to make sure I have a way to get home.



### Avoiding crowds & quiet exit options

- If I want to avoid the crowds, I can wait in my seat.
- I can also think about **leaving a little early** if I don't want to be in a big crowd

- If there are delays, cancellations, or changes, I will hear about them on screens, loudspeakers, and on the stadium website.
- I can also follow Commbank

  Stadium's social media or
  check their website for live
  updates.

- If I have questions about accessibility or inclusion, I can contact the stadium's customer service team.
- I can visit the **stadium website** to find the right person to contact for accessibility help.

### **Providing Feedback**

 If I want to give feedback, I can do it on the stadium website or at customer service points inside the stadium.

# **Toilets & Accessible Facilities**

- I can find toilets, accessible toilets, and Changing Places facilities throughout the stadium.
- I can check venue maps or ask staff to help me find the nearest toilet.

### **Getting Help**

- Venue staff and security are there to help me if I need it.
- I can look for staff wearing uniforms and name badges.
- If I have a question, I can go to an information desk at key points in the stadium.

### Support

- There are generally quieter
   areas in special seating zones.
- If I want to avoid big crowds, I can think about coming during off-peak times.
