

Video Transcript: What is the role of a museum curator?

The role of a museum curator is so wide and has so much different aspects to it, but I think principally we are the custodians of objects, artefacts, paintings that belong to the museum and we have to look after them.

I think the thing about the V&A is it's a national collection, it's owned by everybody, and so it's so important we preserve it for the future.

We look after our objects so we can inspire the future generations of people who can walk round our galleries or look at our online presence, and really get a sense – I hope – of joy, and wonder, and inspiration of seeing that material.

The curator's real role to look after the objects and the title I have is a keeper represents that. Of keeping everything safe.

There's no point having these objects if people don't know what they are, if we can't tell people what they are. So I suppose for me it's a bit like i'm an interpreter of these objects for others.

It's a very meaningful way of life, it's very satisfying to share your enthusiasms with the public and to learn fresh ways of looking at the things you thought you researched as a historian and then suddenly you find they have new meanings because of who you're sharing them with.
