Newcastle Building Society tech team volunteering with Newcastle United Foundation to help boost pupils' digital skills

A team of Digital and Technology colleagues at Newcastle Building Society are investing their time and talent to work with Newcastle United Foundation to deliver a series of computer science and engineering-based workshops to local pupils. The programme involves real-world application through mentoring and hands-on activities to encourage young people to pursue careers in these areas.

The programme, delivered by Newcastle United Foundation with the support of eight people from the Society's Digital and Technology department, takes place at NUCASTLE powered by Newcastle Building Society, Newcastle United Foundation's new community hub. The science, technology, engineering and maths (STEM) sessions are set to run throughout the summer term and, so far, have involved teaching local school children how to program Sphero coding robots to move and undertake basic actions, encouraging innovative thinking and exploration.

One of the volunteers, Paul Douglass, is a user experience designer at Newcastle Building Society. Paul said: "As a parent and a school governor I know how packed the curriculum is and how important digital literacy is. It's fantastic to see opportunities like these STEM workshops being provided for children to try something new, and you can clearly see how much they enjoy the coding sessions and how engaged they are. It's amazing to think that the new skills that are being developed here are ones that they can take into their future careers."

Manila McLean, chief information officer at Newcastle Building Society, added: "The enthusiasm colleagues have shown to help deliver the STEM sessions with Newcastle United Foundation reflects our wider ambition to find new ways to work collaboratively to help bridge the digital skills gap that persists across the region, especially amongst younger people.

"Coding is one of the skills which will only grow in importance, and even a basic understanding could be the spark which leads to a much deeper interest in STEM subjects and all the opportunities which will follow."

In July 2020, the Society entered a six-year partnership with Newcastle United Foundation worth £1.1 million, including support for their flagship employability programme, NUFutures. The partnership also helped to deliver the Foundation's state-of-the-art community facility, NUCASTLE powered by Newcastle Building Society, which opened in Newcastle in March 2022.

The facility provides access to extensive sports and fitness activities for the community, as well as delivering wellbeing and education programmes for the wider region, supporting people become fitter, healthier, more active, and develop their employability skills.

Andrew Foster, Head of Programmes and Impact at Newcastle United Foundation, said: "The fantastic support and commitment from Newcastle Building Society to provide meaningful opportunities through Newcastle United Foundation programmes is helping to connect and inspire communities across the North East.

"From our charity's home at NUCASTLE, our specialist STEM suite is a unique space for young minds to explore the possibilities that science, technology, engineering and maths holds for them in their future – whether that's in education, recreation or potential careers.

"Volunteering support from the Society is key in delivering exciting and engaging Foundation sessions for the next generation and we look forward to seeing where their passion for STEM takes them."

Colleague volunteering is one way in which Newcastle Building Society supports its local communities, with more than 900 days volunteered in 2022. Volunteering friendly policies, including two days of paid volunteering leave, enabled colleagues to volunteer more than 900 days in 2022.

Activities they have supported include: packing goody-bags for NHS staff, building workplace employability and skills through coaching and mentoring; cleaning beaches and maintain parks and woodlands, delivering food parcels, supporting food banks, and making hot meals for those in need.
