

4 March, 2024 Building Society's Tech Powers Up Next Generation

Colleagues from the North East's largest building society are helping to upskill and inspire the next generation by donating IT equipment to one of the region's best-known charities.

Young people from Newcastle United Foundation are already getting to grips with the laptops thanks to a donation of 50 devices from Newcastle Building Society.

Led by Newcastle Building Society's community development specialist, Ken Hines and colleague device technical lead, Andy McAlpine, colleagues from the Society's Digital and Technology team delivered and set up the laptops which will be used by young people on the charity's employability and skills programmes to help search for jobs, write CVs and upskill in digital literacy.

The programmes take place at the Foundation's community hub, NUCASTLE powered by Newcastle Building Society, and the equipment will benefit around 50 young people by supporting with their employability skills and enabling them to create and share digital content.

Michael Conville, chief customer officer at Newcastle Building Society said: "Our partnership with Newcastle United Foundation is all about creating meaningful opportunities that engage and inspire communities across the North East.

"Digital skills have never been more important for young people entering the world of work, however we know some young people lack basic IT skills, such as the understanding of emails and the ability to search the web.

"That's why it's so important to our Society that we support young people with the tools they need to break down the barriers to digital literacy and develop the employability skills they'll need on entering the workplace."

In July 2020, the Society entered a six-year partnership with Newcastle United Foundation worth £1.1 million, including support for their flagship employability programme, NU Futures. The partnership also helped to deliver the Foundation's state-of-the-art community facility, NUCASTLE powered by Newcastle Building Society, which opened in Newcastle in March 2022.

The facility provides access to extensive sports and fitness activities for the community, as well as delivering wellbeing and education programmes for the wider region, supporting people become fitter, healthier, more active, and develop their employability skills.

Andrew Foster, Director of Programmes and Impact at Newcastle United Foundation, said: "It is critical for young people today to have access to digital devices as they navigate their education, job opportunities and the workplace in a technology-driven world.

"The generous donation of 50 laptops from Newcastle Building Society will help enable teenagers and young adults we engage through our NU Futures programme to build their digital literacy and improve their confidence using systems and programmes crucial to moving closer to the world of work.

"Our key partnership with the Society continues to deliver life-changing impact for communities across the North East through NU Futures and together we are empowering hundreds of young people to achieve their full potential."

Newcastle United Foundation's NU Futures programme provides life-changing opportunities through education and employment support for schoolchildren, teenagers, and young adults. Through one-to-one mentorship, interpersonal skill-building, inspirational apprenticeships, and work placements, 92 percent of the next generation have improved self-confidence and 98 percent improved their teamworking skills. Since September 2023, more than 150 NU Futures participants have been engaged, earning 66 qualifications, and facilitating 83 job starts and 25 apprenticeships in career paths based right here in the North East.
