'In belonging to Kerry, you belong to the elements. You belong to the spheres spinning in the heavens." So proclaimed noted playwright and proud Kerryman John B Keane, a view that is very much shared by the rest of the county. Those not from Kerry may roll their eyes, but they too know that Keane wasn't far off the mark. In Kerry,

you strike the mother lode of blockbuster Irish scenery, a

nighlight of the Wild Atlantic Way of which visitors' Irish

fantasies are made.

n the north, not far from the county town **Tralee**, there's the magnificent coastline surrounding **Ballybunion**, made up of epic stretches of sand and searing cliffs like Banna and Ballyheigue beaches and the wildlife paradise that are the **Bromore Cliffs**.

Kerry's dramatic peninsulas are peerless when it comes to untamed natural beauty. The **Dingle Peninsula** stretches out into the North Atlantic toward nmost point. At its tip is **Slea Head**, where a collection of well-preserved structures from Ireland's ancient past is set against some stunning coastal scenery.

At the heart of it all is **Dingle**, or **An Daingean**, its hilly streets lined with colourful shops and pubs that sometimes double as a grocery shop or haberdashers. This is one of Ireland's most creative corners, with a rich musical

The mountainous Iveragh Peninsula is dominated by the mighty Macgillycuddy's Reeks, topped by Ireland's highest peak, Carrauntoohil Part of the range sits within the stunning Killarney National Park, a natural wonderland dripping in gorgeous views. The whole lot is wrapped in the bow of the famed Ring of Kerry, a 179km-long spectacle of landscape and heritage, including **Derrynane House**, the former home of the Liberator Daniel O'Connell and now the only National Historic Park in Ireland.

Even the stars are special here, as much of the Ring is part of a 700-sq-km Dark-**Sky Reserve**. On the ground, though, twinkling loughs and emerald-green ields surrender to dramatic cliffs and golden crescents of sand, while offshore a necklace of islands lure visitors with their remote charms.

The most famous of these are the **Skelligs**, of which the largest, **Skellig Michael** was an early Christian outpost recast in 2017's The Last Jedi as the ideal spot for a Jedi Master in hermetic exile. To the north, just off the tip of the **Dingle Peninsula**, the **Blaskets** bear traces of the inhabitants that lived here until 1953, when they were deemed too remote for full-time living.

Not everyone may be fortunate enough to belong to the spheres spinning in the elements, but we all want to see what it looks like.

The whole Skellig Coast is inspiring and energising with rich cultural and natural landscapes, monastic and medieval history and the Iveragh Gaeltacht (Uíbh Ráthach).

There's a wide arc of history too, from the Tetrapod tracks on the shores of Valentia Island – the earliest fossil footprints in the world, to the nearby site of the first Transatlantic Cable, and from Daniel O'Connell's birthplace at Cahersiveen and home at Derrynane House, to memories of Charlie Chaplin, who loved to holidav in Waterville.

Kells Bay Gardens contains a large collection of tree-ferns and sub-tropical plants and is home to The SkyWalk, Ireland's ongest rope-bridge. At St. Finan's Bay a very earthly pleasure iwaits with a cup of hot chocolate at Skellig Chocolate, Europe's most westerly chocolate factory.
