Stretching from just south of Dublin to the country's southeasternmost corner, counties Wicklow and Wexford are a gift of lush greenery, fascinating heritage and sunny beaches.

Immediately south of the capital. County Wicklow is a wild pleasure garden of dramatic mountain scenery and beautiful coastline. Inland from stunning Brittas Bay is a wonderland of magnificent country estates like Avondale. **Powerscourt** and **Russborough**. Palladian piles built to showcase the wealth and taste of the 18th-century elites. Surrounding them are some of Ireland's nost beautiful gardens, including Mount Usher and the landscaped terraces at Kilmacurragh and Kilruddery, each a gardener's paradise.

Beyond the garden walls is a different kind of landscape, a wild topography of gorse- and bracken-clad moors and corrie lakes nestled in the crevices of a mountain chain that in parts is as raw and desolate as nature can be. Tucked away in one of its glacial valleys is the monastic site of **Glendalough**, one of Ireland's most significant early Christian settlements, built from the 6th century and proof that its architects had a deep appreciation for a stunning setting. There's more recent history too, in the imposing structure of Wicklow's **infamous gaol**, now one of the county's most popular attractions.

Wexford's spectacular beaches and relatively temperate climate have long made it a favourite summer getaway, with the beaches at Courtown, Duncannon and Curracloe especially popular with visitors to the 'Sunny Southeast.' Wexford's beaches are the grace notes of a spectacular coastline, which is easily explored via a spidery network of narrow country lanes that weave past quiet coves, ancient ruins and once-mighty abbeys - just north of Duncannon is beautiful Dunbrody Abbey, still remarkably intact 1000 years after its construction by Ireland's first Norman invaders. At the tip of the peninsula is the world's oldest working lighthouse, Hook Lighthouse, originally built in the 13th century but since equipped with a modern light to guide seaborne vessels.

Ireland's more recent history is told in compelling detail in Wexford's collection of interactive museums, including the Irish National Heritage Park outside Wexford Town; the National 1798 Rebellion Centre on the edge of Enniscorthy; and the powerfully memorable **Dunbrody Famine Ship** docked in New Ross, which tells the story of the tragedy and perils of 19th-century emigration.

History, heritage and stunning scenery: you'll find an abundance of each in both Wicklow and Wexford, which are as welcoming as they are easily explored.





BLACK CASTLE VIEW POINT

An area of outstanding beauty, the Black Castle ruin stands on a rocky headland over the sea. There is a fine vantage point for views over the town and the coast of North Wicklow from the ruins.

MILITARY ROAD/SALLY GAP DRIVE

This winding and twisting road provides spectacular scenery along its entire route, including the Glencree Valley, Kippure Mountain, Sally Gap, Glenmacnass Waterfall, Lugnaquilla, and the Glen of Imaal.

THE MOTTEE STONE

Situated just outside the beautiful small town of Avoca and just off the Rathdrum road lies the Mottee Stone. Legend has it that Fionn MacCumhaill hurled the stone from the top of Lugnaquilla Mountain. However, geologists would suggest that it is one of many erratic boulders that were carried in the great ice flows of the Ice Age. An area offering panoramic views of the surrounding countryside.

THE WICKLOW WAY

The Wicklow Way, 127 km long, was Ireland's first waymarked trail, and due to its proximity to Dublin has remained one of the most popular walking routes in Ireland. www.irishtrails.ie

Just a few miles north of Wexford Town, Ballinsker and Curracloe are a popular location with holiday makers. Curracloe was also the location for the film 'Saving Private Ryan'. Further north are, Ballymoney, Courtown and Morriscastle Strand Courtown a popular holiday resort with a nice sandy beach it offers a wide variety of
