

North Kerry An area of outstanding beauty, rural bliss, stunning beaches, famous links, historical icons and literary giants! Head 10km west to Fenit Village, take a stroll on the harbour and see the statue of St. Brendan and enjoy some of the finest seafood restaurants in the country. Further north into Ardfert Village is the site of a 6th century monastery, three medieval churches and several grave slabs along with Ardfert Friary situated in an open field just a short distance from the cathedral. Continue to Banna Strand, a 7km stretch of sandy beach, and north to the coastal village of Ballyheigue, the starting point for Kerry Head with 18kms of stunning views of the North Kerry coastline as well as the Dingle Peninsula and County Clare. Ballyduff, 24km from Tralee is home to Rattoo Round Tower which stands on the grounds of an applient monastery and The North Kerry which stands on the grounds of an ancient monastery and The North Kerry Museum is also close by. Ballybunion, 34km from Tralee, is a coastal town with impressive beaches, cliff walks, golf courses, seaweed baths and The Bromore Cliffs. Tarbert village, at the very northern tip of Kerry, is where you will find Tarbert Bridewell Jail and Tarbert House and is where you can also eat the the form to killings. Courty Clare, Listonal is 28km from Trales. also catch the ferry to Killimer, County Clare. Listowel is 28km from Tralee and is the birthplace of some of North Kerry's most prominent writers and home to Listowel Castle, Kerry Writers Museum, St. John's Theatre and Arts Centre, The Lartigue Monorail, and The Garden of Europe. To the east of Tralee, visit Castleisland and Crag Caves to experience an indoor wonderland of stalagmites and stalactites.

Dingle Peninsula An area of outstanding beauty and jaw dropping scenery, rugged cliffs and seaside trails. A 50km drive from Tralee is Dingle, a fishing town located on the harbour with bright colourful shops, cafés, pubs, and restaurants. The Conor Pass, Ireland's highest mountain pass provides the most dramatic and scenic way of crossing from the north to south coast of the Peninsula. Slea Head is at the westernmost



part of the Dingle peninsula and at Dunmore Head the westernmost point in Ireland. The Slea Head driving route is a circular driving route beginning and ending in Dingle, the route itself is narrow and winding, it is recommended that the 47km loop is travelled clockwise. Enjoy amazing close-up views of the Blasket Islands and distant views of the Skellig Islands on the western horizon.

The Ring of Kerry A 179km circular route in the Iveragh Peninsula, the largest of all of the Southern Peninsulas and often described as one of the most beautiful parts of Ireland. Begin this spectacular route from Tralee by heading 26km south through Killorglin and enjoy the rugged and winding coastal roads overlooking the spectacular Atlantic Ocean. The Skellig Ring Scenic drive starting at Cahersiveen taking the coastal route to Waterville showcases magnificent views of Valentia Island and Skeillig Michael, located just 15km from the mainland. This Wild Atlantic Way journey enjoys 13 signposted Discovery Points for fantastic photo opportunities along the way. Continuing your journey back to Killarney through the scenic villages of Caherdaniel and Sneem to the Killarney National Park.
