Be prepared to be observed in a live setting practical example such as a family engagement meeting, early help meeting, parenting programme, visit to a home, multi-agency meeting or contact with children, young people and families
Ensure that you showcase your application of the required knowledge, skills and behaviours
Be prepared to answer questions to meet any gaps not covered during the observation of practice
