Government funding band – **£6,000**



On-programme duration – **A minimum of 12 months**



Gateway requirements – **Apprentices must have level 1 English and Maths (optional for 19+, please see funding rules)**

Apprentices must have passed Emergency First Aid at Work (regulated or unregulated and conforms to Health & Safety guidelines)

Apprentices must submit a portfolio of evidence for the professional discussion



End-point assessment method – **A knowledge test, an observation with questions and a professional discussion**

Working as a Professional Security Operative

The broad purpose of the occupation is to be an organisation's first line of defence against activities that threaten the security of the UK and continuity of its organisation's core businesses. Professional security operatives protect people, assets, property, and premises via a layered security approach.

The programme's structure

There are 4 pathways to the Professional Security Operative. The apprentice will be placed in one of the following roles: operational security operative, cash and valuables in transit operative, mobile security patrol operative or security control room operative. Apprentices will be placed in a role over a minimum of 12 months during which they will be supported while on-programme by their tutor. The tutor will review the progress of the apprentice against the standard to ensure they are prepared for the end-point assessment.



Your apprentice's journey



Ready for training

- Initial assessment

Set for assessment on completion of training and functional skills

End-point assessment methods are:

Knowledge test:

- A 60-minute test consisting of 40 multiple-choice questions

Observation with questions:

- A 90-minute observation followed by 30-minutes for questions
- Observing the apprentice completing their normal duties in the workplace

Professional discussion:

- A 60-minute professional discussion, with a minimum of 8 questions
- A portfolio of evidence will have been completed to support the answers in the discussion, the portfolio will not be assessed
