(M) Demonstrate a thorough knowledge of the task to the team by way of a brief	
(M) Identify a number of hazards which may be associated with the equipment and explain the measures in place to safeguard these	
(D) Correctly identify, report and follow through rectification procedures	
(D) Plan and conduct the safe and expeditious movement of aircraft within the area of responsibility	

Assessment criteria	Key points to remember
Airside marshalling	
(P) Ensure the correct marshalling equipment is available	
(P) Wear the correct personal protective equipment (PPE) for marshalling	
(P) Prepare the aircraft stand/ramp area for activity	
(P) Interpret and use correct, clear signals to and from the flight deck of an aircraft correctly	

Assessment criteria	Key points to remember
(P) Identify which route the aircraft is to be marshalled	
(P) Provide the flight deck crew with guidance to safely position aircraft	
(M) Ensure that the aviation area is clear of foreign object debris (FOD)	
(M) Demonstrate an awareness of adjacent aviation activity

(M) Ensure correct number of personnel are available to safely move the aircraft	
(M) Coordinate the actions of marshallers and other functions	
(D) Take action to reduce adjacent conflicting activity	
(D) Demonstrate a sound awareness of all emergency signals
