## Safety, Health and Environment Comparison AP03 to AP02

The main changes to the assessment plan are as follows:

- Level 1 ICT is no longer a gateway requirement.
- The EPA period will typically last 4 months.
- The overall EPA grading method has changed:
  - o To gain a pass, apprentices must achieve a pass in all 3 assessment methods
  - To gain a distinction, apprentices must achieve a distinction in all 3 assessment methods

There have also been some changes to the assessment methods and new assessment criteria has been written by the trailblazer group. These changes are outlined below.

## **Knowledge Test**

This will now consist of 40 multiple-choice questions with a duration of 60 minutes. The pass mark has increased to 70% (28/40) and the distinction mark has increased to 85% (34/40).
