Celebrate with Postman Bear!


You will need:

- Thin card (e.g. an old cereal box)
- A pair of scissors
- Paints and a paintbrush, colouring pencils or crayons
- A glue stick
- String or ribbon

Instructions:

- 1. Ask an adult to help you carefully cut around the template, following the dotted line.
- 2. Glue your envelope to the card and, with the help of an adult, cut around it again.
- 3. Get creative! Decorate your envelope using colouring pencils, pens or paint.
- 4. To wear your special letter ask an adult to help you pierce the holes in the places marked X and thread, string or ribbon through the holes and knot together to hang around your neck (making sure it's not too tight).


Celebrate with Postman Bear and make your very own origami envelope!


You will need:


- Paper either square or A4 cut to size
- Paints and a paintbrush, colouring pencils or crayons
- A glue stick or sticky tape
- String or ribbon


Instructions:


- 1. If using A4 paper follow these instructions before you get started, with the help of an adult:
 - a. Place the paper on the table (portrait)
 - b. Hold the top right corner of the paper and fold it towards the lower left side so the paper forms a right-angle triangle. There should be a small rectangular section left at the bottom.
 - c. Cut the rectangular section off using scissors and unfold the paper
- 2. With the help of an adult make an origami envelope, following these instructions:
 - a. Place the square paper on the table so its corners are in a diamond shape
 - b. Fold the left corner in so it meets the middle of the paper
 - c. Fold the right corner in so it meets the middle of the paper
 - d. Fold the bottom point into the middle
 - e. Add glue or sticky tape to stick the bottom fold to the two sides of the envelope
- 3. Get creative! Decorate your envelope using colouring pencils, pens or paint. You could draw a picture of an acorn and add your very own special message just like Postman Bear, or even draw your favourite Acorn Wood character!
- 4. Ask an adult to help you pierce holes either side, thread string or ribbon through the holes and knot together to hang around your neck (making sure it's not too tight).










