

Fresh, wild, and darkly funny, Verena Kessler turns relatability into the extreme in this unsettling novel, for fans of Emma Cline and Ottessa Mosfegh.

A woman walks into a gym. She's looking for a job and, in her desperation for a fresh start, she'll say anything. In a moment of panic she pretends to have a new baby at home and now she must keep up the lie at all costs . . .

As she becomes increasingly obsessed with pushing her body to its limits, her colleagues start to ask questions about her mysterious corporate past and her imaginary baby and her story is not adding up. Suspicions snowball, culminating in a violent return to a version of herself she thought she'd left behind. Her probation officer won't be pleased.

One of the freshest new novels of recent years, with an unforgettable protagonist and the ratcheting pace of *Yellowface*, the humour of *Big Swiss* and *My Sister, the Serial Killer*, and the addictive darkness of Ottessa Moshfegh and *Love Lies Bleeding*, *GYM* is a propulsive and shocking story of obsession, self-destructive ambition and the acts we are capable of when backed into a corner.

Born in Hamburg in 1988, **Verena Kessler** studied at the German Institute for Literature in Leipzig. Her debut novel, *Die Gespenster von Demmin* (*The Ghosts of Demmin*, 2020), was nominated for numerous prizes including the aspekte Literature Prize. Her second novel, *Eva* (2023), was awarded the Der zweiter Roman prize. Her work has been translated into French, Polish, Czech, Greek and Bulgarian..

A lyrical story of pandemics, wars, and revolutions in eighteenth-century Europe, from the Booker Prize-shortlisted author of *The Long Take*.

Amid the turmoil of war and destruction in eighteenth-century Europe, three artists were trying to make sense of rapid change, of ruination: Tiepolo, Piranesi and – particularly – Goya. They are joined, from the margins, by a strange figure – a refugee, an observer, an idiot savant, a Pulcinella, a Fool or Trickster. Nell is another outsider, there on the edge; another loner or non-conformist, whose mutability seems to ensure his survival in a shifting world.

A multi-voiced hybrid, *Days of Drowning* is a new way of telling a story. A prose narrative with the dense music of poetry, an historical novel, an examination of the central importance of art and culture, particularly in times of social and political upheaval. It is also a book about ageing, a story of pandemics, wars and revolutions, dynasties and dictators, power and corruption and social collapse that speaks to our current moment.

Set in the latter half of the 18th century and the beginning of the 19th, the novel's turbulent backdrop is the decline and fall of the Venetian Empire, the convulsions of the French Revolution and the disintegration of Spain: war and destruction throughout Europe – displacement, plague and famine. Each artist finds different ways to examine this world of power, moral and social dissolution, the barbarism of war – to bear witness.

An award-winning poet, **Robin Robertson** has received the Petrarca-Preis, the E.M. Forster Award from the American Academy of Arts and Letters and all three Forward Prizes. *The Long Take* won the Walter Scott Prize for Historical Fiction, the Roehampton Poetry Prize, the Goldsmiths Prize for experimental fiction, and was the first poem to be shortlisted for the Booker Prize.

Originally delivered as a series of lectures at Trinity College, Cambridge, in *A Chorus of Ears* Denise Riley meditates upon the emphasis our literary culture places on the person(a) of the poet, relegating their actual poetry to a second-order importance. Prize culture and the primacy of the poet – as opposed to the poem – transform criticism into a beauty contest, constraining our ability to meet the lyric on its own terms.



His novels include Walk Don't Walk, Big Morning Blues, The Camp, The Upper Pleasure Garden and From Scenes Like These, which was shortlisted for the inaugural Booker Prize in 1969.
