


Happy Birthday, Gruffalo!

How to Draw THE GRUFFALO

Trace over the grey lines to learn how to draw the Gruffalo!





- Start by drawing two horns, two ears and the back of the Gruffalo's head. Then give him a blobby nose, a pointed chin and a big jaw.
- 2 Draw the Gruffalo's back. Give him a round tummy and leave a gap for the leg.



 Add two knobbly knees, then draw the rest of the legs and feet.
They look a bit like woolly socks.
Leave a gap for the Gruffalo's tail.



⁴ Draw two curved lines either side of the gap you left in step 3.Add a feathery end to finish the tail.

5 Draw the Gruffalo's arms and hands. Draw one finger extended, as if the Gruffalo is making a "Shh!" sound!




- 6 Add the details. Draw claws and add prickles along his back. Draw the eyebrows at an angle and add two eyes. Then give the Gruffalo a little fluffy tuft of hair.
- 7 Give the Gruffalo a big grin! Then add one big tusk and some square-shaped teeth.
 Finish your Gruffalo by adding fur and whiskers.

Now have a go at drawing your very own picture of the Gruffalo from start to finish! You can follow the steps above.




How to make the mouse
