#### STRAND 1

#### HAVING GREAT LEADERSHIP

- Has your club reviewed and updated its governance policies, procedures, and leadership structure for the new season?
- Has your club completed the England Hockey Membership Process and set up on the Game Management System (GMS)?
- 3. Do you have a clear understanding of your club's goals for the season (grow, retain, diversify), and is there a strategic plan in place to achieve them?
- 4. Is there a clear communication plan in place for the committee and club members, including regular meetings and updates?

#### BEING LOCAL WITH STRONG COMMUNITY CONNECTIONS

- 1. Have you identified potential partnership opportunities with local schools, clubs, or organisations?
- 2. Does the club have a clear community engagement strategy?
- 3. Is the club visible and active within the local community?
- 4. Has the club considered participating in local community events or initiatives?

  environmental impact wherever possible (e.g. energy efficiently
  and stick animosity, inclusive practices, communication –
  accessible formats)?
- 3. Do you have emergency plans in place for your facilities (including first aid, severe weather, and evacuation procedures)?

#### BEING FRIENDLY, WELCOMING AND SOCIAL

- Are there social events, Pick Up a Stick Open Days or club activities planned for the start of the season to welcome new members?
- 2. Has the club created a welcoming environment for players from diverse backgrounds?
- Is there effective and regular communication with members and the wider community through various channels, including social media?
- Has the club implemented safeguarding policies, best practice standards and procedures to ensure a safe and inclusive environment for all?

#### HAVING INSPIRED AND EFFECTIVE PEOPLE
