London Hockey Juniors Review 2023-2024

The Junior section had an extremely busy season with activity covering Club leagues & festivals; In2Hockey Cup & Plate Tournaments at U10 & U12; U16 & U18 Indoor competitions; School competitions and Talent Development activity.

<u>Clubs</u>

Activity was arranged for groups aged U8-U18 as follows:-

- U8 U12 Mega and Mini Leagues with 164 teams entered
- U10 & U12 In2Hockey Cup & Plate involved 216 teams across the two age groups and genders.
- U12 Performance Leagues (7 a side) had 38 entries across the two genders.
 Winners Boys Teddington ; Girls Surbiton
- U14-18 leagues a total of 210 teams entered.
- The U14 Leagues were rearranged after Christmas after the U14 SupraLeague qualifiers were identified. The remaining Tier 1 teams were placed in a Tier 1B league with the stronger Tier 2 teams. Finals were held for the Tier 2 & Tier 3A Leagues.
- This season U16 Tier 1 entries were made centrally with England Hockey following a reframing of the Tier 1 Competitions. Tier 2 and 3 remained unchanged with Finals for T2 & 3A.
- The U18 Tier 1 & 2 teams also participated in a cross-border leagues. Crossover Finals were held where appropriate.
- EH Tier 3 Knockout Cup & Plate Competitions for U14s & U16s had 49 entries
- Indoor Area Finals were held in November & December for the U18 & U16 Boys & Girls. 20 teams entered across both age groups & genders.

Supraleagues

U14s

At the Christmas break, a number of teams qualified for the U14 national Supraleagues:-

U14 Boys – Wimbledon Stormers, Surbiton Seals and Blackheath & Elthamians U14 Girls - Surbiton Wrens, Teddington, Surbiton Eagles and Wimbledon Stormers

In the National finals, two teams from the Area qualified and finished as follows:-

U14 Boys – Wimbledon Runners-up U14 Girls – Surbiton Winners

U16s

The new format for the U16s is essentially a waterfall tournament where in the first part of the season, the teams played in geographically arranged leagues with their position at the end of January determining the competition they would play in for the remainder of the season. The top 16 teams remained in the T1 Cup in a league format with a Finals day for the top 4 teams.

The next 24 teams were placed in a T1 Plate & Vase and the remainder in Shield, all which were a knock-out format

There were some issues in the second part of the season largely around the distances some teams were expected to travel & the scheduling of some knock-out rounds on consecutive weekends. EH have acknowledged the problems and will take steps to avoid the same issues arising next season.

In2Hockey

The In2Hockey Cup & Plate was again a hugely successful tournament with the Preliminary Rounds held over two weekends in March. The 4 qualifying teams from each of the age group & gender Cup & Plate competitions played at the Finals day at Lee Valley in April.

Additionally, a number of disciplinary issues arose as the result of some unacceptable behaviour during the course of the season & again, we are working with the Clubs to avoid further occurrences.

A Junior Clubs meeting was held on 12th June at The Wimbledon Club with representatives from 16 clubs in attendance. Useful discussions took place on the various leagues & competitions & proposals for 2024-2025. Thank you to Wimbledon HC for hosting us.

Many thanks to the League/In2 Competition/Mega & Mini League/U12 Performance Administration team of Adrian Darley, Jenny Walker & Andrea Cole for all their hard work over the last 12 months as without them, the huge amount of activity organised by the Area would not have happened. Also, many thanks to all those who gave up their time to run the various tournaments on our behalf, it is much appreciated.

Enormous thanks also to Joergen Jaehnig for leading on the Indoor competitions. They were very successful and a very enjoyable experience for the players.

<u>Talent System</u>

Development Centre (DC) activity ran throughout July & August for U12-15s for around 785 children, a number of whom were selected to the Squad Assessment phase. The players selected for 2022-2023 squads were not required to attend the DC but were invited for assessment together with the players taken through from DC in October. A further 90 new players were assessed alongside the previous season's squads for the U16 & U17s

The Assessment phase was complicated & extended due to the TA Assessments at some centres not being completed until January 2024.

Following the Assessment sessions, 450 players were selected for 20 representative squads, two squads being selected for each gender in each age group.

After the training phase was completed, all the teams participated in the South Counties AC Championship playing against the seven counties which formed the former South Region. Matches were played in a triangular format across weekends in March-May.
