

NW Hockey Junior Strategy: 2024-27


"Increase the range of opportunities to play in a positive environment to foster a life long love of the game"

- Promote a positive experience for all attending NW Junior Hockey events and use to promote opportunities to get involved in supporting hockey in the NW.





Who leads what at Area & County level

U8 / U10 / U12 County led activity



- ➢U8, U10 and U12 County organised festivals.
- ➢U10 In2Hockey top 2 teams at County finals go to Area Finals (26 April 2026)
- U12 In2Hockey top 2 teams at County finals go to Area Finals (26 April 2026).
 Winner at Area Finals goes to National Finals (16 May 2026).

U14 / U16 (currently no U18s)

- >Area led activity for Tiers 1 & 2
- County led activity for Tier 3/4

U14 – U16 - Guidance for Tiers



Tier	Guidelines
Tier 1	A good team with talent players (NAGS/TA/County) this should be where any club that is accredited as a Talent Centre are competing (both genders and multiple age groups). This will involve travel for your team/s across the breadth of the Area.
Tier 2	A competitive side which is looking for good opposition and competitive matches. Division within the age group league will be arranged geographically. A National Age Group player may only play Tier 2 if their junior section does not have a team in Tier 1.
Tier 3	Development leagues to introduce players to competitive games and/or to provide games in a less competitive environment. Match dates are likely to clash with County activity. Tier 2 players should not play in a National Age Group squad or at a Talent Academy.
Tier 4	Festival type activity with a more flexible format.

ENTRY DEADLINE – 31ST JULY 2025

>Area League & EH Club Champs tier must match.

➢Pre-Christmas - play within Area league.

➢Post-Christmas – top 3 teams from Area League go to Supra League.

Remaining U14 teams join Tier 2 teams or, maybe Tier 1B with top finishing teams from Tier 2. Possibly increased travel post Christmas.

ENTRIES OPEN – 1 AUGUST 2025

Central entry via England Hockey

Direct entry to Supra League – played from September onwards. Geographically based initially, with travel extending as rounds progress.

Teams play for Cup, Plate or Vase as rounds progress, so losing teams still have something to play for.



ENTRY DEADLINE – 31 JULY 2025



What we did in the league this season Pre-Christmas




2024-25 - 6 leagues involving 18 different clubs (92 clubs across NW!).

- U14 T1 (boys) 1 pool, 5 teams (2 to supra league, then T1b after Christmas)
- U14 T2 (boys) 2 pools, 4 teams in each
- U14 T2 (girls) 3 pools, 4 teams in each (two teams went to Supra League)
- U14 T2 (boys) 2 pools, 4 teams in each
- U16 T2 (girls) 2 pools, 3 teams in each (2 withdrew so 1 pool after Christmas)
- U16 T2 (boys) 2 pools, 2 teams, 3 teams (after 1 team withdrew)


What we did in the league this season Post-Christmas

- Focus minimal travel due to impact on cancelled fixtures. 24-25 format:
- **U14 boys** new T1B league (remaining T1 teams + top two T2 pools). No finals as single pool.
- **U14 girls** only 2 teams entered T1 this season, so these teams joined the T2 teams for matchplay before Christmas, then went to Supra League. Remaining teams formed 2 pools and had a league final to determine a winner.
- **U16 boys** Straight league with 2 pools home and away matches before and after Christmas. League finals.
- **U16 girls** 2 geographic pools (3,3 teams) which merged to one pool due to 2 x withdrawals. No finals.
- * Next season we will run league finals in all groups regardless of pools to give teams a finals day to work towards.



Withdrawals from the league

 Fewer withdrawals from the league this season. Clashes with County/TA activity has improved. U16 age groups can struggle post-Christmas due to GCSE pressure.


Centralised Calendar

Topics for Discussion



- Entry numbers consider ways to build numbers. Encourage new clubs to enter / smaller clubs to combine to form joint teams. 18/92 Clubs in NW participating.
- Communication improve communication with County organisers & build participation through schools & smaller clubs (Can clubs reach out to local state schools to offer help?)
- > Withdrawals what problems do clubs face? How can we help?
- Format largely dictated by numbers, but which format do clubs prefer? Happy with how leagues worked this year?
- Fees will increase/be introduced this year. (League £40, Indoor £75, u14 Festivals £25, In2 Hockey Finals £40)
- NEW! England Hockey have updated their Trans/Non-binary policies. New Regs will apply, which mean for juniors age 12+ there will be a girls and an open/boys category. To read the full update see the EH website England Hockey Transgender and Non-Binary Participation Policy
- NEW! Clubs who don't enter T1 or T2 2 x u14 mini festivals for smaller clubs Sun 2 November (South) & Sun 1 March (North) – NORTH DATE SUBJECT TO CHANGE
