

# 4. Review of North West Hockey 2023-24



#### Annual Review 2023-24

Welcome to our third annual review and report to members since the incorporation of North West Hockey Lid in June 2021. At the end of our third full season, our five core functions - adult leagues & competitions, junior leagues, & competitions, masters, officiating and discipline, the Board and Management Committee, and other Committees have continued to develop and deliver an increasing range of activities for the North West Hockey Community. All Members are thanked for their support and input and particular to those who have attended our popular NW Clubs Forums and meeting.

As Chair, I continue to be extremely proud of what is achieved each season by our volunteer's especially as so many are also still activity involved playing, umpiring, coaching, managing and contributing to running their Club's and Counties as well. I would like to take this opportunity to thank all the volunteers involved in delivering North West Hockey's core activities and to all the volunteers in Clubs who we work with on and off the pitch.

Our Annual Review highlights progress, challenges of our core activities and provides a snapshot of what has been delivered in the past 12 months. In 2023-24 we have continued to focus on delivering at a grass roots level to support playing, officiating and the supporting governance. We have also continued work on our NW Strategy based on our experience of running hockey in the North West, Feedback, input and ideas from our clubs received at Forums and against the new England Hockey Strategy for our Sport

New and activities delivered in 2023-24 include:

- . Developing and sharing our new Officiating Strategy to support this vital part of our sport
- · First State Schools Tournament with 18 schools taking part
- · Running our first Senior Indoor competitions
- . Introduce a new Equality, Diversity and Inclusity role to support our work

The challenges we reported in 2022-23 remain but we are working to identify ways to support clubs and our committees to address some of the impacts. We recognise that Clubs face similar or linked challenges so the more we can work together to address and support the better for all. We're continuing to focus on how we:

- Support the retention, development, and attraction of Officials (umpires, match officials, umpire developers and coaches) to take Club and NW Area appointments and to support Club Officiating. Our new Officiating Strategy addresses many of the challenges faced
- · Work together to ensure hockey is a safe, enjoyable and welcoming sport to play, officiate, coach and watch
- . Conduct and the EH Respect Code, Equality, Diversity and Inclusion and Safeguarding
- . Identify and to address the challenges of attracting and retaining volunteers at Club and Area

# 8. North West Hockey Ltd Annual Accounts

- The Company's Annual Accounts were included with the information pack and have been independently scrutinised.
- At the end of 2022-23, we reviewed our accounting systems and now use Xero to manage our bookkeeping and
  financial activities, supported by our appointed independent accountants. This has reduced our book keeping costs and
  improved the control and management of our finances.
- For 2023-24, the highlights are: -

• Turnover - £58,797

• Operating Costs - <u>£51,871</u>

Surplus on the year - £ 6,926

- Ring-fenced Reserves from dissolved associations as of 30<sup>th</sup> of April 2024 £118,727
- The accounts have been approved by the Board and submitted to Companies House and HMRC
- We are exempt from Corporation Tax; however, tax is payable on Interest received from the Reserves.

# 8. North West Hockey Ltd Annual Accounts

#### **Membership Subscriptions and Fees for 2024-25**

- Having reviewed our 2023-24 Accounts, for 2024-25 we are proposing the following:
- A £3.00 increase in Area Membership Subscription from £17.50 per Team to £20.50 per Team
- A £3.00 reduction in Adult League Entry Fee from £10.50 per Team
   Please note as in 2023-24, this includes Development Teams
- These Subscription and Entry Fees require approval at this AGM by the members present.
- We therefore have the following two resolutions:



### 9. Resolutions

#### 9.1 Area Membership Subscription for 2024-25

#### **North West Hockey Ltd propose that:**

- For full voting Member Clubs that the annual Subscription for 2024-25 for membership of North West Hockey Ltd shall be <u>£20.50 per senior team</u>
- For Counties and other Organisations, Subscriptions for 2024-25 shall be set at zero, (no change to 2023-24)



### 9. Resolutions

#### 9.2 Entry Fees for North West Adult Leagues for 2024-25

#### **North West Hockey Ltd propose that:**

- For Clubs entering teams in North West Hockey Adult Competitions and Leagues, the annual entry fee shall be <u>£7.50 per Senior Team</u>
- That entry fees for all other competitions (including Juniors and Masters) shall be set by the Directors on the recommendation of the relevant Committee and, if required, following informal consultation with member clubs



# 10. Other Fees & Subscriptions for 2024-25

- All no increase on 2023-24
- Appointed Umpire Fee £26.50 per umpire per appointment
   (Adult League and EH Cup games where umpires are appointed by North West Officiating)

- North West Masters Membership £10.00 per player per annum



# 11. North West Hockey Growth Fund

- As part of our Area Strategy, we have set-up the North West Hockey Growth Fund.
- The Fund has been set up using money from our Reserves and the income from League Fines.
- The Initial fund has been set up as follows:

• Adult League Fines £6,500

• Area Reserves £23,785

Total Fund as of June 2024 £30,285

- To manage the fund a new committee will be set up; NWH Growth Fund Committee.

# 11. North West Hockey Growth Fund

As part of our **Area Strategy**, we are delighted to officially announce the **North West Hockey Growth Fund** (supporting our clubs to grow all aspects of the sport), full details will be published shortly.

- Flyerz hockey
- Schools outreach
- Umpire radios (limited to 1 pair per club)

- The EH Centralised Calendar is available on the EH Website
- A North West Calendar of important dates and events will be available in July 2024. Note all League Reserve dates
- Season start date: 21st September 2024\* (\*Subject to division size, 13 team divisions will start on 14th September 2024)
- The 8 Area review of the Adult League Regulations is complete. Publication expected end of July 2024
- All feedback collected during the 2023-24 season was discussed during the Adult League Regulations review (particularly Appendix 5)
- The Development Team guidance will be updated
- The Umpire Approval guidance will be updated

- The North West league structure review is complete
- Adult League entry was 1st May 2024 (25 Clubs missed the deadline, have delayed fixture publication)
- North West fixture generation in draft: Publication expected July 2024
- A new pre-season tournament at Sedbergh is to be held on 31st August and 1st September 2024
- ALMC applications open in July 2024 and publication expected in August 2024
- EH continuing improvements to GMS. A new GMS Working Group was established in 2023-24 season
- A reminder that all Club and Team Admins must have their email and telephone numbers visible on the GMS
