A reminder... The London Area is defined by the London Metropolitan Area and clubs were automatically made a member of this new Area 3 years ago. Due to its unique nature London Hockey also took on the responsibility of the Sub Area or County as the pre-existing County structure elsewhere in the country did not fit coherently within London.

Historically clubs would have been a member of a Region, a County and often League organisations with fees paid to all. London Hockey has replaced all of those.

We believe that this will benefit our members with London Hockey being able to deliver activity more effectively, efficiently and with best interests of the whole Area and Sub Area at heart.

- In this third year of running London Hockey our committees have been able to grow their activity and launch new initiatives such as London Hockey Futures and the Club Umpire Development Strategy.
- Congratulations to Georga Reed on winning the England Hockey Area Volunteer Award 2024. We also congratulate Sara Walker and Lynne Morgan on their British Empire Medals for their services to the hockey community.
- Tim Forte, our Officiating Chair, has stepped down after three years with Peter Mackintosh (who was the Appointments Lead) taking on the role.
- Vikki Leach will be leaving us after one year in her role as ED&I Director.
- We recruited a finance administrator to support our committees and the Talent Pathway administrators (more detail in Finance section)

Adult London Hockey Leagues 2023 - 2024

- 173 men's teams and 165 women's teams competed in the London Hockey Leagues in the past season with 3,724 fixtures scheduled and mostly played.
- Congratulations to West Herts Men's 1s and Wapping Women's 1s for winning the London Premier Division titles and earning promotion to the EHL East Conference.
- It was a very close and competitive season as the winners and promotion spots in 14 of the 29 London divisions were decided only in the last two rounds of fixtures!
- Congratulations to our top goalscorers Max Spedding (34 goals, Old Tonbridgians M1, Men's Division 3 South) and Catherine Smith (33 goals, West Hampstead W1, Women's Division 1) on their fantastic goalscoring exploits this season.
- Only Imperial Medics M1 and Old Kingstonian M1 withdrew from the 2023 - 24 season

Adult Hockey

A successful Area Indoor competition was held in December with Old Cranleighan Men and Southgate Women winning the London tournaments.

Introduction of Development Teams at Grade 5 level to enable new, young or returning players to gain league experience and to develop their ability and confidence.

The annual review of the Adult Regulations League Regulations by the 8 Areas and England Hockey has resulted in the Youth Experience Player (YEP) section being removed from Fair Selection as this was being exploited in some Areas.

Adult Hockey

London Hockey has always strived to deliver fair and enjoyable hockey for all participants regardless of the level that they play at. In the recent post-covid seasons we have been lenient in imposing sanctions at some Grades, including points deductions and fines. From next season we anticipate being stricter with teams and players at all levels in expecting their compliance with the Adult League Regulations.

There was a rise in the number of low-level complaints after matches had taken place, often related either to on-field conduct by players or umpires/umpiring standards.

Masters Hockey Leagues 2023 - 2024

- 52 men's teams from 34 different clubs and 20 women's teams from 17 different clubs competed in what was possibly the best year yet of the Masters Leagues.
- Six new teams will be joining the league: MO50 - Surbiton Jokers, Sevenoaks; WO35 - Marlow and Havant; WO45 - Bromley & Beckenham and Surbiton Sages
- Our aim is still to attract more South East and South Central teams so there will be Masters leagues in all Areas in the South of England. A premier division structure with more local Area leagues sitting underneath, as feeders. We are in constructive discussions with Areas and leading clubs about this.
- All of the South Masters Leagues will continue to be administered by London Hockey.

Masters Representative Hockey

- London Representative teams are participating in Area Tournaments around the country with 9 men's teams in the age groups MO35-75s and 7 women's in WO35-65.
- For the first time we entered a London only MO35 and WO65 team and sent more players to the WO70s friendly. Our MO75 are still combined with SC and SE but we hope to split as soon as enough players come of age. A further 120 players came forward for selection this year with a total of 550 Masters members on our books.
- London Masters MO50, MO70, WO40, WO45 all won their tournaments with MO45, MO75 and WO55 all finishing as runners-up. Congratulations all!
- London Hockey hosted three Area Masters tournaments this summer; the WO50 at Surbiton HC, MO55 at Southgate HC and MO65 at Richmond HC

Junior Hockey Leagues 2023 - 2024

- Nearly 700 teams entered the London Leagues, Mega and Mini Leagues, In2Hockey Cup & Plate (U10/U12) and Indoor tournaments (U16/U18)
- Seven club teams from London qualified for the national U14 Supra Leagues with Wimbledon U14 Boys finishing runners-up and Surbiton U14 Girls winning the title!
- There was a new national competition format for the U16 club teams at Tier 1 Level. London clubs were very successful with Surbiton winning both Boys and Girls Cups while Wimbledon were the Girls Cup runners-up.
- Following the London Indoor rounds, the Surbiton U16 Girls, U18 Boys and U18 Girls and Teddington U16 Boys represented London in the Super 6s Finals. Both Surbiton U18 Boys and U16 Girls finished runners-up.
- A number of disciplinary issues arose as the result of some unacceptable behaviour¹⁷

London In2Hockey Cup & Plate 2024

216 club teams entered the hugely successful U10 and U12 tournaments with the preliminary rounds held over two weekends across London in March. The 4 qualifying teams from each gender/age group played at the London Hockey Finals Day at Lee Valley Hockey stadium in April.

This year the winning teams came from Surbiton, Spencer, Wimbledon and Ashford.

Wimbledon U12 Boys & Surbiton U12 Girls both qualified for the National Finals. Wimbledon Boys finished runners-up and Surbiton Girls took home the national title!

Schools Hockey

Marilyn Walker, Sandra Marlow and Stephen Biggins continue to oversee the extensive London Schools competitions programme, both indoor & outdoor formats.

A total of 62 Schools (up by 29) entered 305 teams across all London competitions.

U13-U18 teams from 7 schools qualified from the London rounds and participated in the EH National Schools Finals.

The London Schools Indoor competitions were won by Whitgift School (U16/18 Boys) and Surbiton High (U16/18 Girls) and they represented London at the National Schools Indoor Finals. Whitgift School won both U16 and U18 titles.

Talent Pathway

The London Hockey Talent Pathway programme consists of three phases: Development Centre (DC), Assessment Centre (AC) and Representative Squads.

DC activity ran throughout July & August for U12-15s with 785 children in attendance. The AC was also attended by players from the previous season's representative squads.

Following the Assessment phase 450 players were selected for 20 representative squads, two squads per gender per age group. The London Hockey squads trained and participated in the South Counties AC Championship across weekends in March to May 2024.

At the end of the London Hockey Talent Pathway programme 101 players have been nominated for assessment at Talent Academies.

Officiating

- A new Club Umpiring Strategy was launched in March 2024 focussing on supporting clubs with developing their club umpires to increase standards across London.
- The reporting system for umpire abuse to tackle misconduct and inappropriate behaviour continues to be necessary. An umpire feedback system was introduced.
- Neutral Umpire Appointments continue to be challenging due to available umpires to appoint to league matches. A prioritisation takes place to best serve the Member Clubs.
- A budget of £ 8,000 will be allocated to Officiating to drive initiatives in these areas:
 - Club Umpire Development (Support, Coaching Days)
 - Performance (Coaching and developing umpires, Radios)
 - Diversity (Women in Officiating Network, Young Umpires)

Discipline

- New Discipline Regulations will be introduced before the 2024 - 2025 season.
- This season there were 19 red cards / MMOs issued to players of London clubs that resulted in suspensions of 16 days or more. A significant increase compared with last season (13). Two players received more than one red card / MMO.
- Nationwide the total of red cards / MMOs leading to suspensions is 200 (reduced from 234 last year). London is therefore making up a greater proportion (10% vs 6%).
- The number of red cards / MMOs being issued for violent offences is also increasing.
- One disrepute complaint has also been upheld against a London club relating to their players' conduct during matches, in particular towards umpires.

England Hockey Club Mark

10 London clubs are currently accredited. We would like to see this number grow significantly increasing minimum operating standards of clubs across the Area. If any clubs are interested in working towards the accreditation in the coming season please contact Gaynor. The process is now much more streamlined.

Youth Strategy

EH are currently developing a Youth Strategy which will encompass community, school and club hockey activity. One of four pilots will take place in London. Any EH activity will sit alongside London Hockey initiatives.

England Hockey Update

Policies

The sport's Code Of Conduct is currently being reviewed and will launch in the coming months. The document will focus on values and desired behaviours.

It will sit alongside new Discipline Regulations which will come into force for next season.

This will be communicated to clubs before the start of season.

GMS

A working group was formed in January by England Hockey to address the concerns of the 8 Areas on the lack of progress in improving the functionality of GMS. Progress remains extremely slow, but we should see some significant improvements for next season.

The group has three focus areas: Matchday Processes, Transfer Process and Data Issues.

Impact Report

At the halfway point of reporting, the projects had introduced hockey to 2.3K new participants with them being mostly juniors from state schools, but also people with disabilities and from the LGBT community. 58% of participants are from black and minority ethnic backgrounds. A full impact report is being compiled at the end of Year 1.

London Hockey have committed to a further 2 years of funding to allow for the London Hockey Futures programme to become established and for projects to have a lasting (and growing) impact.

- London Membership rates have remained unchanged for 3 years.
- Adult hockey is the most consistent of the 4 activities; Masters Hockey has increased significantly, as has Junior Hockey - in both its Area (Club In2Hockey, Leagues etc.) and County (Talent Pathway) manifestations.
- In 2022 Masters League Fees were still recorded under Adult Hockey League Fees.
- The Board decided not to charge Umpire Appointment Fees for 2022 - 2023 season.

Comments

- Junior Club Hockey Costs have increased significantly largely due to pitch hire energy costs which we are looking to address through an increase in League Fees and In2Hockey Fees.
- The Talent Pathway ran at a significant loss in 2023. Although much improved in 2024 with continuing cost pressures we will look to address further in 2025.
- Adult Hockey surplus will partly fund Club Umpire Development programmes.
- Masters Hockey surplus will be used to professionalise coaching set up.

- Insurance includes cover for Talent Pathway and Representative Teams activity which have both increased significantly.
- Special Projects and Grants - 50% of the London Hockey Futures programme funding is covered by the P&L with the other 50% being drawn from reserves.

Financial Accounts

- London Hockey overall remains in good financial health. However some significant changes have affected the 2023 accounts which are now showing a substantial deficit. This was mostly due to the late recording of costs related to FY 2022. The 2024 accounts recorded a small surplus.
- Lucy Barlow did not take up her position as Finance Director due to personal reasons.
- Given the Finance Director vacancy the Board agreed to set up a Finance Team to restructure processes, address issues and set up a framework to manage our finances. This team led by Marcel van Eldik included Mark Bennett (Governance Director), Fiona Isacsson (Operations Director) and Step Parikian (Finance Administrator).

Financial Accounts

The Finance Team dealt with a number of issues:

- Established a streamlined payment processing process including a single point of contact (invoicing@london.hockey) for submitting invoices and all queries
- Set up controls to have a clearer understanding of budgets and outstanding invoices
- Cleared a serious backlog of umpire expense claims and other payments
- Timely invoicing of fees and other costs to our clubs, individuals, schools and other organisations

It is important to highlight that the financial pressures, which are no doubt being felt by clubs, are also being felt by London Hockey. We continue to review our fees and we anticipate certain fees (not set at the AGM) to rise in the current season.
