

## **Annual Review 2023-24**

Welcome to our third annual review and report to members since the incorporation of North West Hockey Ltd in June 2021. At the end of our third full season, our five core functions - <u>adult leagues & competitions</u>, <u>junior leagues & competitions</u>, <u>masters</u>, <u>officiating</u> and <u>discipline</u>, the Board and Management Committee, and other Committees have continued to develop and deliver an increasing range of activities for the North West Hockey Community. All Members are thanked for their support and input and particular to those who have attended our popular NW Clubs Forums and meeting.

As Chair, I continue to be extremely proud of what is achieved each season by our volunteer's especially as so many are also still activity involved playing, umpiring, coaching, managing and contributing to running their Club's and Counties as well. I would like to take this opportunity to thank all the volunteers involved in delivering North West Hockey's core activities and to all the volunteers in Clubs who we work with on and off the pitch.

Our Annual Review highlights progress, challenges of our core activities and provides a snapshot of what has been delivered in the past 12 months. In 2023-24 we have continued to focus on delivering at a grass roots level to support playing, officiating and the supporting governance. We have also continued work on our NW Strategy based on our experience of running hockey in the North West, feedback, input and ideas from our clubs received at Forums and against the new England Hockey Strategy for our Sport

New and activities delivered in 2023-24 include:

- Developing and sharing our new Officiating Strategy to support this vital part of our sport
- First State Schools Tournament with 18 schools taking part
- Running our first Senior Indoor competitions
- Introduce a new Equality, Diversity and Inclusity role to support our work

The challenges we reported in 2022-23 remain but we are working to identify ways to support clubs and our committees to address some of the impacts. We recognise that Clubs face similar or linked challenges so the more we can work together to address and support the better for all. We're continuing to focus on how we:

- Support the retention, development, and attraction of Officials (umpires, match officials, umpire developers and coaches) to take Club and NW Area appointments and to support Club Officiating. Our new Officiating Strategy addresses many of the challenges faced
- Work together to ensure hockey is a safe, enjoyable and welcoming sport to play, officiate, coach and watch
- Conduct and the EH Respect Code, Equality, Diversity and Inclusion and Safeguarding
- Identify and to address the challenges of attracting and retaining volunteers at Club and Area

- 4,500+ players across the NW Women's divisions
- 4,540 NW matches per season (fewer forfeited than 2022-23)
- Second season of Development Teams and bedding in (20 Men's (12 more than 2022-23) and 21 Women's (6 more than 2022-23))
- Attempted to created Divisions of 12 where possible.

- 3rd year of our new Junior competitions programme delivered through our committee of volunteers and this season we also took on organising the new format state schools' festival
- Continue to be increasing the hockey opportunities for young players in addition to county run activity, club fixtures and EH Championships
- NW Junior Leagues (U14 and U16) 44 teams competing (10 withdrew). 3 teams were combined teams with clubs joining together to enter teams.
  - o U16's Boys (10) / Girls (7)
  - o U14's Boys (16) / Girls (11)
- North West Finals Days delivered for U10 and 12 In2Hockey and U14 and U16s
- Festivals style events and tournament run for U8 / U10 / U12s / U14's through counties to encourage participation and more playing opportunities.
- Ran our second Junior Indoor competitions for U16 and U18 boys and girls with Brooklands, Timperley, Chester and Bowdon progressing to the national indoor finals
- The new format EH State Schools Festival held in March 2024 was a big success with 18 schools taking part and offering hockey for those schools developing their hockey offer
- Schools also progressed to EH School Championship finals through the Area feeder competitions. Thanks to all those involved in helping to organising.



- Masters continues to grow and offer more hockey across the North West and England!
- Our committee of volunteers are committed to developing Masters hockey for all and have organised:
  - o NW masters gathering / training / games including roll ups for more social hockey
  - o In 2023 organised NW representative teams:
    - Men's O35 to 70's (8 teams)
    - Women's O35 to O60 (6 teams)
    - Run the popular NW 500 Summer Mixed Master league and finals day
- Players have registered and paid £10 registration fee supporting the self-funding of the programme (370 in 2022-23)
- NW500 Mixed Master summer hockey second competition in 2023 and third season in 2024 showing the demand for different social format ways to play
- Men's and Women's NW Representative Teams selected to take part in 2024 Area Tournaments from O35s to Men's O70s / Women's O60s
- 2023 Women's O35 Champions for 2<sup>nd</sup> year running sadly couldn't complete the triple in 2024
- Successfully rolled out use of Pitchero Platform to manage squad / player administration due to the growth in player numbers and activities to streamline admin and volunteer time
- Hosted 8 Area Tournaments for Men's O60 and Women's O60s in 2023 at Timperley
- Hosted 8 Area Tournaments for Men's O40 in 2024 at Timperley

## **NW Officiating Highlights**

Another challenging season the highlight being the work to develop and publish our North West Officiating Strategy, priority plans and alignment of our structure to the key themes. Highlights for the season include:

- 27 umpires on the Men's Panel and 17 on the Women's Panel taking North West appointments in 2023-24.
- 5 umpires gained their L2 and took appointments and 5 umpires returned to the Appointed Panels.
- Umpires were appointed to all North West Premier League (men and women's) games in 2023-24.
- North West Umpires took 12 NPUA appointments in 2023-24.
- 2 umpires gained there L3 and joined the NPUA.
- Efforts were made to encourage Club Umpires to gain there L2 to umpire their Club's Division 1 games and to support Club Umpires doing such games,
- We have continued to focus on development and using tournaments to support umpires through to assessment and progression through our excellent coach development and mentor team.
- Development events for club umpires:
  - o Cheshire Cup Finals (August 2023) 6 umpires focused on level 2/3 development.
  - O Manchester Tournament (Sept 2023) 36 umpires received coaching, 14 passed Level 1 assessment. The Tournament was also used to develop umpire support.
  - Lancashire Cup Men's and Women's Finals (April 2024) umpire's and umpire support were appointed by NWHOC Developer Leads,
  - Junior Umpire development at NW Finals
    - U10 / U12 In2Hockey Finals 20 young umpires took part.
    - U16 NW junior Finals 2 young umpires took part.
    - 2 Young Umpires went on to national finals.
- Online Club's Umpiring Forum held in September 2023 and Umpire Development Forums held November on 'Improving Decision Making' with Annette Badger and in May 2024, Confident Umpiring,' with Gemma Jones

## **Discipline Highlights**

- All Disciplinary matters (other than Disrepute's which are managed by England Hockey) are managed through the Area, and we continue to work closely with the other 8 Area: Area Discipline Administrators (ADA) and England Hockey
- Conduct towards officiating continues to be of concern.
- Wider issue of conduct and RESPECT remains a priority to address across all involved for 2023-24.
- Important that Club and Captains build in discussions on <u>RESPECT</u> code and conduct into pre-season preparation to build support and greater awareness around on behaviour
- Working with 8 Areas on the discipline process review

## Our Finances 2023-24:

- Report to the Directors and Unaudited Finance Statement for the period 1<sup>st</sup> May 2023 to 30<sup>th</sup> April 2024 has been approved by the Board and will be shared at the AGM. This forms part of our statutory reporting to Companies House.
- Operating income for 2023-24 was generated through: Area Membership Fees, League and Competition Entry Fees, League fines and fees to clubs for Appointed Umpires.
- Our total income and expenditure are down, as 2022-23 included the purchase of new Masters kit.
- The Area has made a surplus for 2023-24, which will be reinvested into new Area projects that will benefit our clubs, details of which will be announced at the AGM.


