RULES & OFFICIALS

RULES

All you need to know about the indoor format's laws and the men and women officiating in the middle!

DURATION Games are four quarters of 10 minutes.

SUBS There are unlimited rolling subs for outfield players but each team can only substitute their goalkeeper for an outfield player twice in a match.

PENALTY CORNERS At a penalty corner, if a defending player crosses the backline before the ball is played the defending team has to defend the penalty corner with one less player. The offending player goes to the half way line.

CORNERS If the ball crosses the backline and was touched last by a player from the defending side, play is re-started by an attacker with the ball on the centre-line and in line with where it crossed the backline. If it is deliberately played over the backline by a defender, a penalty corner is awarded.

CARDS

A green card means the player goes to the sin bin for one minute

A yellow card means the player goes to the sin bin for a minimum two minutes

A red card mean the player is permanently suspended from the game

SHOOTOUT The exciting way to decide the result if the score is level at full-time! Here are the rules:

- Three players from each team take part
- The player has the ball three metres outside the D, with the keeper behind the backline
- The player has six seconds to score
- If the scores are still level after three attempts each the competition moves to sudden death

THE RORD TO THE DERBY FRENK...

BUCKINGHAM AND EAST

GRINSTEAD, who were both at last season's Super 6s showdowns, return to Finals Day for another go at the national title. They will be joined by Slough, who seem to alternate* the years they appear in the finals having been present in 2022, 2019 and 2017, and Surbiton who are making their first appearance.

Buckingham suffered a heavy defeat at the hands of Repton in last season's final but arrive here having finished undefeated at the top of the table, four points ahead of their nearest rivals, Slough. Buckingham have appeared at the last five indoor finals days, but only have one title to their name – they won in 2020 edging past Bowdon Hightown 4-3 in the final. Given their tabletopping status, can they add a second title this year? East Grinstead can actually go one better than Buckingham and can boast having been at every finals day since 2018. They have three indoor titles to their name and were national winners in 2016, 2019 and 2021.

However, despite their sporadic appearance in the finals in recent times, it is Slough who have the finest indoor pedigree with 14 indoor titles to their name, although none since 2017. They finished in second spot in the league, also undefeated, and will be hoping to add to their rich history of indoor titles.

For all their success outdoors, Surbiton are the new kids on the indoor block. They were comfortable in fourth place in the league with a gap of five points over Guildford in fifth and will be hoping to cause an upset along the way. LAST SEASON'S FINALISTS, Wimbledon & Old Georgians, both return to the national stage for another attempt at the Super 6s title. Wimbledon will be going for three-in-a-row having beaten East Grinstead and Old Georgians in 2022 and 2023 respectively. Meanwhile, Old Georgians will be looking for revenge having been denied by the barest of margins in last season's final following a shoot out.

First though, they will both need to get past Sevenoaks and Hampstead & Westminster if they are to get another go at the final against each other.

Sevenoaks arrive here having finished in second place in the league with 17 points, just one point ahead of Wimbledon

- their 4-4 draw against Hampstead & Westminster on the final day of the league giving them a slight advantage in the table.

That draw was also vital for Hampstead & Westminster as it meant that they finished on the same points as East Grinstead and by virtue of their superior goal difference, grabbed the last place at today's finals denying the West Sussex side a double appearance with their women's team in what would have been a repeat of last year.

Old Georgians comfortably topped the table for a second year running with a gap of four points over Sevenoaks in second, and Wimbledon finished in third spot, just one point behind the Kent side.

Last season's 6-6 scoreline in the final will be difficult to beat in the excitement stakes, but we're sure that our four semi-finalists will give it a good go!

239 goals were put away (9 more than last season) in 36 games including 143 from open play, 80 from penalty corners, and 16 penalty strokes.



The Men's Premier Division saw 294 goals (29 fewer than last year) in 36 games made up from 209 field goals, 77 from penalty corners, and just 8 from

the spot.

MEN

Sally Walton, who this year swapped her allegiences from Bowdon Hightown to Buckingham, finished as equal top goalscorer with Slough's Jordan Homann, both scoring 12 goals apiece.

Buckingham and **Slough** come into the finals undefeaed, with Buckingham having won all but one of their matches – a 3-3 draw against none other than Slough.

Slough opened the scoring on just the fourth minute and the teams traded blows. Buckingham looked to have bagged all three points until a last-minute equaliser from Slough's Ellie Yeomans ensured that both teams ended the tournament undefeated

Buckingham can revel in the glory of being the highest scoring team in the league (just...Slough are just a goal behind), with **34** goals to their name - Sally Walton netting 25% of thoir tally

Old Georgians's **James Carson** netted **17** times with **11** field goals and **6** penalty corners to put him top of the shots in the men's game.

Old Georgians won the greatest number of games, but did suffer defeat at the hands of Hampstead & Westminster in a 16 goal encounter that saw H&W win 10-6. Hampstead

& Westminster had the edge throughout but Georgians' Alan Forsyth levelled the scores at 6-6 in the 32nd minute. However, an onslaught of four goals from four different goalscorers in the last three minutes saw Hampstead take all three points and inflict a dent in the otherwise unblemished record of the table-toppers.

**Old Georgians** grabbed the most goals, hitting the back of the net a stunning **62** times – an average of 7.75 per match and 23 goals MORE than their nearest rivals on points, Sevenoaks.

In the league, it was a 2-2 stalemate with a super finish after East Grinstead scored two last-gasp goals to steal a point from Slough, who had led the match until the 38th minute.

Harriet Ward opened Slough's account on the 6th minute when she fired home from a penalty corner, and joint tournament top-scorer Jordan Homann doubled their lead on the 20th minute from open play.

Slough look set to take all three points, but East Grinstead had other ideas with Summer Knight-Thompson netting a field goal in the 38th minute and captain Chloe Brown scoring from a penalty corner in the dying seconds of the game to make it even-stevens, showing it's never over till it's over!

East Grinstead finished in third spot this season but topped the league last year, so are not to be messed with, but Slough have a stellar story to tell in the indoor game with a huge 14 titles to their name - more than any other club in the country. However, their last title was way back in 2017, so Slough will certainly be looking to add to that this Sunday.

fourth minute, but as the first quarter came to a close, Maddy Newlyn got Buckingham back on level terms.

Slough regained the lead in the second quarter through Harriet Ward, taking a 2-1 lead into halftime, but Sally Walton, who is the tournament's other joint top scorer, scored a third-quarter brace with two penalty corner conversions leaving Slough chasing the game for the first time in the match. But chase they did, and they were rewarded with a 40th minute strike from Ellie Yeomans which meant the points were shared.

Last season, this was the opening semi-final of the Super 6s and it was Buckingham who edged it 4-3 following a brace from captain Lottie Porter which, together with contributions from Rebecca van Arrowsmith and Alex Naughalty saw Buckingham overturn a 2-0 lead from East Grinstead.

This season, the league match saw an eightgoal thriller, but one that Buckingham always looked to be in control of.

The first quarter was goalless, but Buckingham went into half-time with a two goal lead, courtesy of goals from Sally Walton and captain Lottie Porter.

East Grinstead pulled a goal back in the third



quarter with Summer Knight-Thompson scoring from open play and in the early stages of the fourth quarter, captain Chloe Brown equalised.

However, Buckingham showed the strength associated with table-toppers and scored three goals in three minutes to pull away from East Grinstead; Walton converted a penalty stroke on the 36th minute which was followed by a quickfire brace from Maddy Newlyn to make it 5-2.

A last-minute consolation goal from Biba Mills could do nothing for East Grinstead, but shows that this is the team that never gives up.


Biba Mills took the lead for East Grinstead as the first quarter came to a close, and captain Chloe Brown added to their account a couple of minutes into the second quarter.

With six seconds left on the clock Buckingham won a penalty corner and Lauren Thomas managed to get the first for her team and last of the final, making Repton Super 6s Finals 2023 Women's Champions.

In a far tighter affair than their 11-1 victory over East Grinstead in 2022, Wimbledon emerged as back-to-back Super 6s victors following a tense 6-6 scoreline against Old Georgians at full-time, with an even tenser shoot-out to decide the winner.

Old Georgians's James Tindall wasn't hanging around as he has two shots in the opening 30 seconds, the second of which was successful and put his side 1-0 up.

Shortly after, a fantastic diving save from Wimbledon's goalkeeper James Bailey helped keep his team in it and a green card for Griffiths gave Wimbledon the opportunity to counter, leading to a cracking goal from Edward Horler. And he didn't hang around either, scoring his second with a running shot over Georgians's George Pinner into the inside of the net.

Old Georgians replied in the first minute of the second quarter with a strong goal from Edward Carson, but Ben Hooper took Wimbledon into the lead, and after an end to end battle Edward Horler made it 4-2 to Wimbledon.

A well played ball from Ashley Jackson and the boards lead to a penalty stroke awarded to OGs and Alan Forsyth snuck it past the Wimbledon goalkeeper's right foot. 4-3!

Into the second half and a full pitch pass and a rebound shot from Edward Horler extended Wimbledon's lead but Old Georgians's Tom Carson found the edge of the circle and looped one over Wimbledon's goalkeeper.

A couple of attempts for Old Georgians failed to find the back of the net with Wimbledon 'keeper James Bailey making multiple saves.

A text book goal then saw Old Georgians's Edward Carson equalise, giving both teams everything to play for in the last eight minutes.

Ed Horler tried to take Wimbledon back into the lead but sent it wide and then Old Georgians's Tom Carson attempted a diving flick, but goalkeeper James Bailey was equal to the attempt.

Old Georgians won a penalty corner and Ashley Jackson flicked it past diving goalkeeper James Bailey to take Old Georgians into the lead, but a quick turnaround saw Wimbledon win a



penalty corner and a slip slap shot from Manuel Prol brought it back to a tie.

With a stop in play and just three seconds on the clock Old Georgians Goalkeeper George Pinner left the pitch to give them the extra player advantage but the match ended 6-6, and so to the shoot out...

But not even this could separate the two teams after the first round of shots! As the crowd was treated to the continued excitement, the final shot of each round-of-three was saved and when Ashley Jackson missed OGs sudden death attempt, Jules Bournac held his nerve for Wimbledon to add the 2023 title to the one they won in 2022.
