VENUE INFORMATION

The Championship Finals will be held at:

Lee Valley Hockey and Tennis Centre, Queen Elizabeth Olympic Park, Leadmill Lane, London, E20 3AD.

HOW TO GET THERE

The Centre is really well connected to all public transport networks.

Trains and Underground

We strongly recommend using the London Underground or Train services to Stratford Station or Stratford International Station.

Stratford Station

Underground - Jubilee Line, Central Line and Docklands Light Railway (DLR)

National Rail - Abellio Greater Anglia for services to Liverpool Street/Essex/East Anglia and London Overground Services.

Stratford International Station

Underground - Docklands Light Railway (DLR)

National Rail - Southern Eastern High-Speed services to and from St Pancreas International

Buses

The following bus routes connect Lee Valley Hockey and Tennis Centre with Stratford and Queen Elizabeth Olympic Park:

The 308, W15, N26 buses stop outside Lee Valley Hockey and Tennis Centre

The 97, 339, 388 and N205 buses all run through Queen Elizabeth Olympic Park

Walking

Below is the walking route from Stratford and Stratford International Station to Lee Valley Hockey and Tennis Centre. Our friendly Hockey Makers will be stationed along the way.



Parking

On competition and event days there is NO SPECTATOR PARKING.

If spectators plan on travelling by car then we recommend parking at Stratford International or Westfield, then walking or getting a taxi to the venue.

TEAMS & OFFICIALS ARRIVALS, DEPARTURES AND TRANSPORT PROVISION

Teams are advised to travel in as few cars as possible. Each team will get five parking spaces, which we encourage to be used via minibuses/coaches.

These spaces will be located in the East Car Park at the venue – stewards will advise on the day. In order to secure these spaces, we require the driver's name and vehicle registration number in advance, please complete the parking form here no later than **Thursday 2nd May.**

→ PARKING FORM

Your details will be added to the parking list. Access will only be granted to those whose details have been logged.

Parking at Lee Valley without completing the form or authorisation will result in a fine by parking eye – England Hockey cannot help with, or refund, this.

Other parking can be found at Stratford International and Westfield Stratford, both are under a 20-minute walk away from the venue. Stewards will be provided maps to these, which they can use to guide drivers to if they turn up to the venue.

SECURITY

The following items are prohibited

- Hard sided containers/bags (spectators, teams are allowed larger bags)
- Bags exceeding 40cm x 30cm x 30cm (spectators, teams are allowed larger bags)
- Large amounts of food or drink (see section; Food and Drink)
- Glass bottles or containers
- Whistles, air horns or noise makers
- Any item which, in the opinion of the Venue, may pose a hazard to the safe delivery of the Event which would include any item that could be used as a potential weapon, compromise public safety, or be used to sabotage or damage property. Examples of these items could include, but not be limited to, sharp or pointed objects such as knives, personal

- protection sprays, fireworks, flares, spray paint or other hazardous substances or gases
- Any article prohibited under law
- Alcohol, unless purchased at the Venue
- Large golf umbrellas
- Large flags or banners
- Laser pointers
- Objects, clothing or signage for the purposes of unauthorised promotional marketing
- Objects, material or clothing that displays a political and/or offensive message
- Cable ties
- Glue
- Chains and padlocks

Visitors in possession of prohibited items may be refused entry, ejected from the Venue and/or referred to the police

Any prohibited items which are surrendered as a condition of entry to the Venue will be unable to be reclaimed and will be disposed of by the Venue without any liability.

Those not part of the playing (16 people max) or coaching staff (4 people max) must purchase a ticket from the website (links on next page).

For those who wish to bring a large group of Under 18s. Please complete the **enquiry form here** and a member of the ticketing team will be in touch. To qualify for the £1.50 price we require a minimum of 10 under 18s.

All tickets are un-allocated seating, but spectators must sit within the open blocks of the East Stand.

CM.com tickets are England Hockey's ticketing partner for this event.

A box office and ticket help desk will be available on the day, which will be located on south street. Purchasing on the day will be chargeable by the 'On the Day' pricing shown, so it is recommended to purchase in advance.

Accessible bays are available for wheelchair users and companions on the East Stand.

COMPETITION DETAILS

The Tournament Director is **Jo Pennycook**. She will issue a schedule for team colours for the days via Altius.

Shey will also issue a written briefing for managers including details of any equipment checks and Altius use on the day.

Managers should report to the TD on arrival at Lee Valley. Her office is in the Sports Presentation cabin overlooking Pitch 1.

TEAM TRAINING, FAMILIARISATION, WARM UPS, WARM DOWNS

Teams can warm up on the pitch once it has been vacated by the previous match. Match timings will be maintained. Non-stick and ball warm up may be undertaken outside the venue, away from spectators.

No cool down time is permitted on the Field of Play (FOP). Teams must exit the FOP via the tunnel on pitch 1, or the entrance on pitch 2 promptly to allow the next teams maximum pitch time prior to their game.

MATCH MANAGEMENT - ALTIUSRT

We will be using the Altiusrt Tournament Management System (TMS) for these finals. This is a TMS that has been used successfully by England Hockey at previous events.

Team Managers should submit a squad list via the AltiusRT system by **Wednesday 24th April**, **1200**. Team Managers will be asked to confirm their team at their meetings with the Tournament Director.

It is important that we have an accurate list for spectators, as this information will be provided in the digital programme and on the big screen within the stadium. For those of you who have not used Altiusrt before, a user guide is attached.

You will shortly receive an invitation to join Altiusrt. This will be a system generated email that will look as though it has come from Stephen Barlow. Please follow the instructions to set up a user name and password. You will also receive another system generated email explaining that you have been allocated as team manager. This will give you the access rights you need to administer your team.

FIELD OF PLAY INFORMATION

The finals will be played on Pitch 1 and Pitch 2 as specified in the match schedule.

Both are Polytan Polygras Platinum CoolPlus fields which are certified to FIH Category 2 until January 2026.

SPORT EQUIPMENT

White Kookaburra Dimple Elite balls will be used. Harrod goals supplied by the venue will be used.

Ball Patrol

No official Ball Patrol will be used for this event.

Balls

England Hockey will provide white Kookaburra Dimple Elite hockey balls for use during matches. Teams are responsible for providing their own practice balls.

Benches

Benches on either side of the centre line will be provided for use of team staff and substitutes. Bench allocation will be as follows: First named team left bench, second name team right bench.

Only those whose name appears on the team sheet may occupy the bench – a maximum of 16 players, team manager and two further officials. A qualified medical doctor may also sit on the bench but if you do not have a doctor, this place cannot be taken by another team staff member.

Chairs will be provided at the officials' table for any suspended players.

TEAM ACCREDITATION

Teams will be given handstamps upon entry to the venue. This is limited to a maximum of 16 players and four Team staff/coaches.

After your final, Hockey Makers will provide coloured wristbands so you can access the Clubhouse for food and drink, and the wider venue to spectate for the remainder of the day.

CHANGING ROOM SCHEDULE/ PRINCIPLES

We have appointed Hockey Makers to assist with reasonable demands during your time at the venue. They will be responsible for conveying information to you from the Competition Manager and will also be your first point of contact should you have any requests for information.

Outside of changing room allocation slots, kit must be kept with you at all times or put into the kit store (Changing Room 9).

Teams will have access to a changing room for 45 minutes prior to and after their game.

TEAM MATCH ANALYSTS AND VIDEO RECORDING

Teams are welcome to use the designated team video area from at the south end of the stadium behind the goal at the top of the south stand – no power is provided in this location so please consider this. Teams intending to use video equipment must get clearance from the Event Manager in advance of the event and follow instructions provided on the day.

Access is only for the purpose of filming, no additional members of team can spectate or coach from this position.

In addition, teams are welcome to use remote cameras, such as 'VEO' or 'Go-Pro's' in agreed locations around the venue. Please check in with the Event Manager on the day to discuss, who will be located in the Sport Presentation cabin in the South East corner of the venue.

POST-MATCH PROCEDURES - COOL DOWN AND LEAVING FOP

No cool down time is permitted on the FOP. Teams must exit the FOP via the tunnel on pitch 1, or the entrance on pitch 2 promptly to allow the next teams ample pitch time for warm up and stick and ball time.

CATERING

Visitors are permitted to bring in the following items, subject to the limitations;

- Empty non-glass containers these can be refilled with drinking water inside the Venue
- Two small pieces of food for personal consumption, e.g. a 160g bag of sweets, a 210g cereal bar and/or one piece of fruit. A maximum of two items per person
- Baby milk and baby food products

If a visitor has a specific medical requirement or allergy then they must seek approval to bring additional food into the venue prior to their arrival to the Venue by emailing events@englandhockey.co.uk

Visitors are not allowed to consume alcohol not purchased at the Venue within the footprint of the event. No alcohol purchased at the Venue can be taken off-site.

Please note that spectators will not have access to the Clubhouse.



TEAM LOUNGE AND SEATING

Teams are welcome to sit in the open seating blocks within the east stand, or the venue café and reception area. However, teams bringing packed lunches must eat these outside the main venue building.

SPORTS PRESENTATION

- Team Entrances will be done for ALL MATCHES on BOTH PITCHES
- Teams to be called off by umpires 5 minutes before the start
- Teams go back towards the changing rooms and line up in the tunnel; the order of captain, starting GK, then shirt number order (team benches for pitch 2).
- When prompted by the announcer/FOP Manager, the umpires will lead the teams out down the tunnel towards middle of the pitch
- As the parade of players and umpires are walking out, their names will be read out over the PA system in the order above.
- When the umpires stop, captains stand next to the umpires with the rest of the team filtering out towards the goal and turn to face the spectators in the EAST Stand (far side for pitch 2).
- When both teams are in position facing the spectators, the umpire next to the AWAY team will initiate the handshakes
- The AWAY team will then walk down the line of players in the HOME team to shake all hands
- Teams then go into huddle 1 minute before start of match
- 10 second count down



MEDAL PRESENTATIONS

- Winning teams will receive a trophy and medals.
- Runners up will receive medals.
- Medal presentations will take place on the pitch immediately after the conclusion of each final.
- Medals are given to the winners and runners-up.
- The Event Manager and Tournament Director will decide when the Officials and Umpires will receive their medals and advise the Announcer of this.

MEDIA OBLIGATIONS

There are no media obligations, but please note an official photographer will be appointed for this event to take photos.

England Hockey's Communications team may speak to the team manager, or a player with the team managers permission for post-event reporting purposes on EH channels.

MEDICAL SERVICES

Medical Provider and Staffing

The Medical provider for this event is Acute Ambulance and Medical Servicers (AAMS).

Acute Ambulance & Medical Services (AAMS) will provide first aid medical personnel; they are

CQC registered and a member of the British Ambulance Association.

There will be an ambulance located outside the venue. The medical room located next to reception in the main venue building will be used for treating all medical issues.

FOP Treatment

The rules of outdoor hockey will apply to medical treatment on the Field of Play. The on duty umpire must stop match play and signal for medical support, whether that through AAMS, or the team doctor/physio, before entering the play – unless the situation is deemed life threatening.
