Junior County Hockey Framework

The JCH Framework is best practice guidance describing the elements that contribute to a great talent foundation environment. It is designed to be both an evaluation tool for counties to determine their current position and a development tool to support a programme to develop its provision and practices for talented young players.

It consists of seven categories which split into sub-sections:

- 1. Leadership and Governance
- 2. Talent Development Environment
- 3. Coaching
- 4. Player Development and Wellbeing
- 5. Culture
- 6. Equality, Diversity and Inclusion
- 7. Stakeholders

Junior County Hockey Development Programme

The JCH Development programme aims to support and educate JCH environments, and the people that make those environments happen, around embracing and embedding talent development principles within the Talent System Framework.

- Recognising talent is about future potential not just current performance
- Implementing the RARE principles Right Athlete Right Environment
- An open, inclusive and 'keep the net wide' approach towards talent development
- Embracing the concept of multiple opportunities, multiple eyes, multiple contexts to understand potential
- Providing quality and frequent training and competition
