Banbury HC Men's through to the Tier 1 Final



Banbury Men's First team qualified for the National Tier One Cup Final by beating one of the nations top sides, Old Georgians, at their ground in the semi finals on Sunday 7th April by a score of 5-3.

Spectators were treated to a great game with entertaining end to end hockey by both teams. Banbury now go on to the final to play Beeston at the Lea Valley Stadium on 5th May.





History making Marlow Ladies

For the first time in the club's history, Marlow women gained promotion to National League after securing the South Central Premier Division title . Marlow scored 80 goals and conceded 18 on their way to South Central success, with young Starlet and ex-Henley player Lauren Hilditch bagging 19 goals in 19 games.

A key part of their success has been the link between Marlow



based schools Sir William Borlase's Grammar School (SWBGS) and Great Marlow School (GMS) with the hockey club.

The Marlow first team squad boasts an average age of 21.8, with little over half the squad made up of school players. A mix of experience and youth has been crucial to Marlow's success and, aside from three players, all are homegrown including captain Rachael Goodwin.

Current GMS sixth form student, Rachel Clarke, has won the "glue" award – an award given to someone who holds the team together, works hard, a good teammate and someone who might go under the radar for player of the match – on several occasions.

Kate Porter, Marlow's first team coach, said: "The positivity from the leadership team has been amazing.

Elsewhere in the club, after missing out on National League promotion to Banbury HC last year the men's first team have lost a significant number of players to injury, relocation for work and to university. This includes Ex-England U18 international Imre Gerrits, who joined Richmond in January and helped gain a spot in the England Hockey Premier Division.

England Hockey also cited Marlow as a talent hotspot last year as the club were among 20 of the elite to achieve Talent Centre (TC) reaccreditation.

South Central Schools In2Hockey Finals

The South Central Schools Boys and Girls Under 13, Under 12, and Under In2Hockey Finals took place at Reading and Sonning Hockey Clubs on 14th, 19th and 21st March.

The Under 13 In2Hockey Tournament attracted the winners and runners up from each of the four County (Berkshire, Bucks, Hampshire and Oxfordshire) In2hockey Tournaments. The winning Boys Under 13 team was Hall Grove (Berkshire). The Runners up were Portsmouth G.S. In the Girls Section, Kings Winchester (Hampshire) were the winners with Cheam (Berkshire) as Runners up. Hall Grove and Kings qualify to represent South Central in the E.H. National Finals in Nottingham on 10th May 2024

There is no National Final for Under 12 or Under 11s. The winning South Central boys' Under 12 team was Dr Challoner's (Bucks) runners up Churchers (Hants). The winning South Central Girls Under 12 team was King Edward V1 (K.E.S.) with Headington (Oxfordshire) as Runners up.

Unfortunately, Bucks did not run an Under 11 Schools In2hockey Tournament and an Oxfordshire team withdrew from the Girls Section. Berkshire 3rd placed teams were delighted to be invited to participate in the South Central Schols U 11 Tournaments.

brilliant team of hugely experienced umpires including a National Premier League umpire! They all gave their time to help the players and teachers develop our sport in their schools. My over riding feeling of the day is that it what sport is all about, players having fun in a supportive environment. Thank you to all those involved, participants, teachers and volunteers.

Umpire Registration - Hockey Hub

Calling all umpires to register on EH Hockey Hub (<u>https://hockeyhub.englandhockey.co.uk/</u>).



We recognise that umpires you have to be registered on GMS but can we ask you to also register on Hockey Hub as the two systems are not linked. This is for two reasons. Firstly, for your benefit, this gives you access to a huge amount of resources regarding your development and that of others that you may be coaching. Secondly, it gives South Central access to club level umpire data which will in turn allow us to create data based plans to help this critical area of the game.

Team Sheets

We would like to remind all South Central Hockey players and club official to pass this on to their selection committees that they need to give consent on team sheets on GMS. This allows records of Goal scorers for end of season awards etc
